DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AT MEETINGS

When declaring an interest at a meeting Members are asked to indicate whether their interest in the matter is pecuniary, or if the matter relates to, or affects a pecuniary interest they have, or if it is another type of interest. Members are required to identify the nature of the interest and the agenda item to which it relates. In the case of other interests, the member may speak and vote. If it is a pecuniary interest, the member must withdraw from the meeting when it is discussed. If it affects or relates to a pecuniary interest the member has, they have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public but must then withdraw from the meeting. Members are also requested when appropriate to make any declarations under the Code of Practice on Planning and Judicial matters.

Have you declared the interest in the register of interests as a pecuniary interest? If Yes, you will need to withdraw from the room when it is discussed.

Does the interest directly:

1. affect yours, or your spouse / partner's financial position?
2. relate to the determining of any approval, consent, licence, permission or registration in relation to you or your spouse / partner?
3. Relate to a contract you, or your spouse / partner have with the Council
4. Affect land you or your spouse / partner own
5. Affect a company that you or your partner own, or have a shareholding in

If the answer is "yes" to any of the above, it is likely to be pecuniary.

Please refer to the guidance given on declaring pecuniary interests in the register of interest forms. If you have a pecuniary interest, you will need to inform the meeting and then withdraw from the room when it is discussed. If it has not been previously declared, you will also need to notify the Monitoring Officer within 28 days.

Does the interest indirectly affect or relate any pecuniary interest you have already declared, or an interest you have identified at 1-5 above?

If yes, you need to inform the meeting. When it is discussed, you will have the right to make representations to the meeting as would a member of the public, but you should not partake in general discussion or vote.

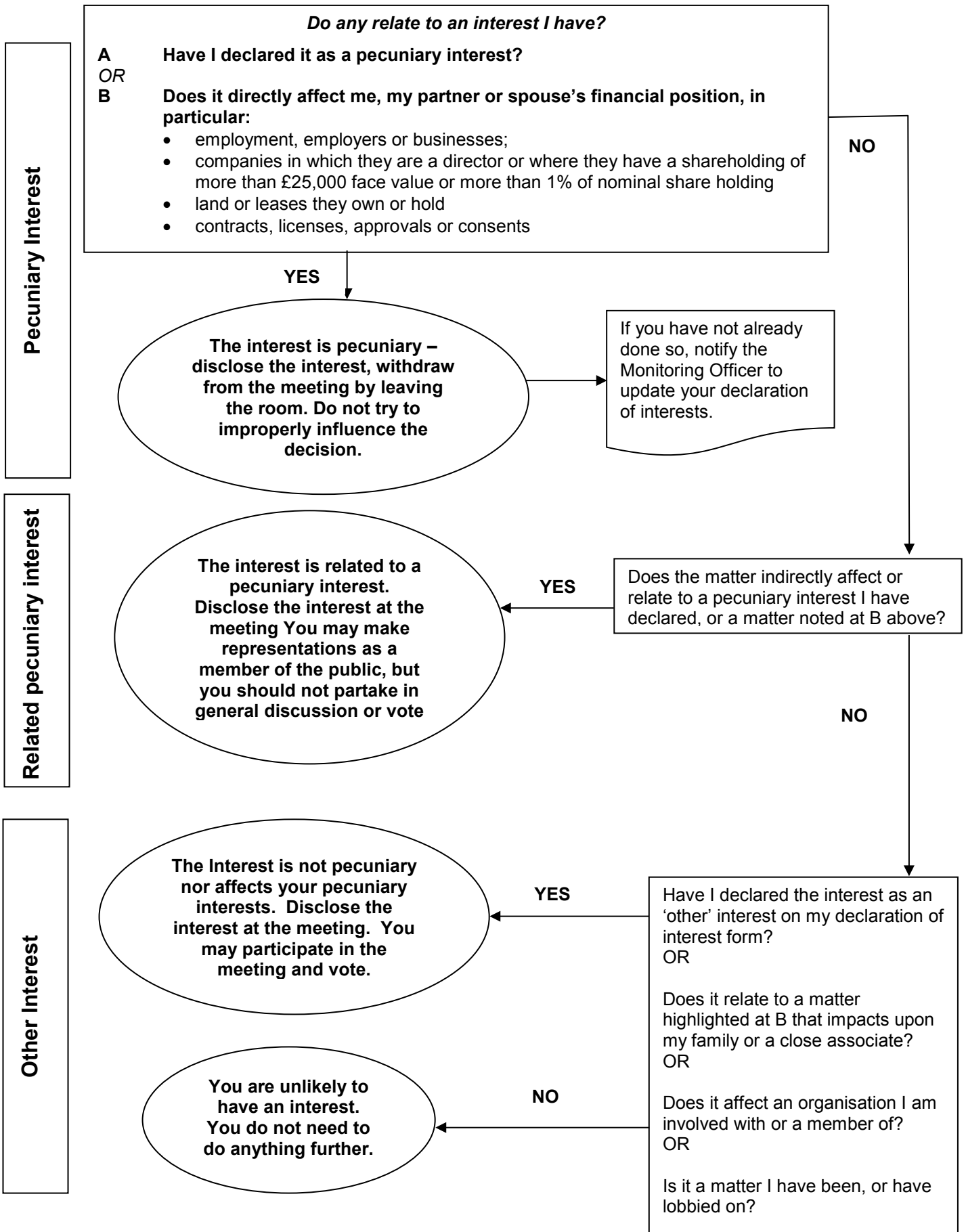
Is the interest not related to any of the above? If so, it is likely to be an 'other' interest. You will need to declare the interest but may participate in discussion and voting on the item.

Have you made any statements or undertaken any actions that would indicate that you have a closed mind on a matter under discussion? If so, you may be predetermined on the issue; you will need to inform the meeting, and when it is discussed, you will have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public but must then withdraw from the meeting.

3491 CHAIRMAN'S ENGAGEMENTS

Members noted the civic engagements attended by the Chairman and Vice-Chairman for the period 19 February to 21 May 2019.

The Chairman explained that it had been both an honour and a privilege to have represented the Council at the numerous engagements he had attended throughout the year. He thanked members and officers for their support, announcing that he had raised over £4, 000 for his chosen charities.

3492 APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL FOR 2019/20

Cllr L Neal proposed, seconded by Cllr P Hardy, that Cllr G Minshull be appointed Chairman of the Council for the ensuing municipal year.

In the absence of other nominations, **it was RESOLVED** that Cllr G Minshull be elected Chairman of the Council for 2019/20.

Cllr Minshull took the Chair and signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office. He went on to welcome all new members to their first meeting of the Council, and to announce his chosen charities for the year ahead; the Muscular Dystrophy Association and the Royal Anglian Regiment Benevolent Fund.

3493 APPOINTMENT OF VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL FOR 2019/20

Cllr A Thomas proposed, seconded by Cllr J Worley, that Cllr F Ellis be appointed Vice-Chairman of the Council for the ensuing municipal year.

In the absence of other nominations, *it was RESOLVED* that Cllr F Ellis be elected Vice-Chairman of the Council for 2019/20.

Cllr Ellis felt it an honour to have been appointed Vice-Chairman, and she looked forward to assisting the Chairman throughout the coming year. She then signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

3494 ELECTION OF LEADER OF THE COUNCIL FOR 2019/20

Cllr S Ridley proposed, seconded by Cllr J Hornby, that Cllr J Fuller be appointed Leader of the Council for the ensuing municipal year. In the absence of other nominations, *it was RESOLVED* that Cllr J Fuller be elected Leader of the Council for 2019/20.

3495 VOTE OF THANKS TO RETIRING CHAIRMAN

Cllr J Fuller paid tribute to Cllr J Overton's service as the Chairman of the Council for 2018/19. He referred to Cllr Overton's commitment, enthusiasm and hard work, explaining that he had been a true ambassador to the Council. He gave mention to numerous events Cllr Overton had attended throughout the year, and

referred in particular to his Chairman's reception, where he raised over £3,000 for his chosen charities.

On behalf of the Liberal Democrat Group, Cllr S Blundell also paid tribute to Cllr Overton, referring in particular to his charity work throughout the year.

3496 MINUTES

With reference to the minutes of the meeting held 18 February 2019, Mrs V Clifford-Jackson drew attention to an error at the top of page 13, which indicated that the Conservatives took control of the Council in 2017. Members noted that this should have read "2007".

With reference to the minutes of the meeting held 28 February 2019, Cllr R Savage advised the Council that he had sent his apologies for the meeting, however, this had not been recorded in the minutes.

Subject to the above amendments, the minutes of the meetings held 18 February and 28 February 2019 were agreed as correct records and signed by the Chairman.

3497 REPORT OF THE RETURNING OFFICER

The Chairman referred members to the report of the Returning Officer, which set out the name of all persons elected as District Councillors on 3 May 2019.

It was unanimously

RESOLVED: To note the persons elected as District Councillors on 3 May 2019 as set out in Appendix A of the report.

3498 MONITORING OFFICER REPORT

Cllr J Fuller presented the report of the Monitoring Officer, regarding changes to the structure of committees, and the allocation of seats and member appointments on committees for 2019/20.

Members noted an error at page 43 (at Appendix 1 of the report), where the portfolio had been incorrectly listed as "People and Communities", instead of "Health, Housing and Wellbeing".

Members' attention was then drawn to the list of committees and allocation of seats, tabled at the meeting. Cllr Fuller explained that further changes were required, and he suggested that the final member appointments be delegated to Group Leaders and advised at a later date.

Referring to the number of seats on committees, Cllr Fuller advised that since writing the report, he wished to propose some further changes. He proposed that

the number of seats on the Emergency Committee be increased from 5 to 6, on the Electoral Arrangements Committee from 7 to 8, and the Development Management Committee Substitute Pool, from 7 to 8. These additional recommendations were seconded by Cllr K Mason Billig.

Cllr Fuller also proposed that in addition to the Electoral Arrangements Committee and the Scrutiny Committee, that there also be a departure from the rules of political balance on the Licensing Committee, with the Labour member, Cllr J Rowe, being offered a seat on each. Members were reminded that this departure from the political balance rules would need to be approved "*nem con*" by Council.

Finally, Cllr Fuller drew attention to paragraph 4 of the report, the Appointment of the Independent Person, explaining that in accordance with the Localism Act 2011, councils were required to appoint an Independent Person to provide views on standards complaints. Members noted that Mr A Oram had been carrying out this role at South Norfolk Council since 2012

It was unanimously

RESOLVED: To:

1. Agree the modification to the delegation of responsibilities, Cabinet portfolio and Cabinet policy committees as outlined at paragraph 1 and Appendix 1 of this report (as corrected at the meeting).
2. Agree the increase in membership of the Electoral Arrangements Review Committee to 8 members.
3. Agree the increase in membership of the Policy Committees and Finance, Resources, Audit and Governance Committee, to 9 members.
4. Agree the increase in membership of the Emergency Committee to 6 members;
5. Agree the increase in the Development Management Substitute Pool to 8 members
6. Agree the amendment to the membership of the Standards Committee.

11. To appoint Chairman and Vice-Chairman as set out in Appendix 3 of the report, the final appointments to be delegated to the Leader of the Council.
12. Agree the appointment of the Independent Person, Mr Alex Oram, to 30 May 2023.

3499 APPOINTMENTS TO OUTSIDE BODIES

Cllr J Fuller introduced the report and referred members to the list of appointments to outside bodies required for 2019/20.

Cllr Fuller advised that the member appointments that had been tabled at the meeting were only indicative and that the final appointments should be delegated to the Leader, in consultation with the Leader of the Opposition, and this was duly seconded.

Referring to the required appointment for the Queens Hill Community Park Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), Cllr C Brown suggested that it would be appropriate for a local member to represent the Council.

In response, Cllr Fuller explained that the CIC would draw from a wide variety of sources, and whilst local knowledge was important, with the Council investing resources in to the scheme, he felt it important that a member of the Council's administration, represented South Norfolk. He was happy to discuss this further with Cllr Brown outside of the meeting.

It was unanimously

RESOLVED: To make appointments to those outside organisations listed in Appendix 2 of the report, for 2019/20, the final member appointments to be delegated to the Leader of the Council (and appended to these minutes)

3500 SCHEME OF SUBSTITUTES 2019-23

Cllr J Fuller presented the report to members, explaining that a new scheme of substitution was required at each new four-year term of the Council.

It was unanimously

RESOLVED: To adopt the scheme of substitution, as detailed in paragraph 4 of the report, for the duration of the Council.

3501 ANNUAL REPORTS AND QUESTIONS TO CHAIRMEN AND PORTFOLIO HOLDERS

(a) Cabinet

Cllr F Curson queried the Council's record regarding equalities and equal representation.

Cllr Fuller advised that 12 out of 46 members elected in May were female, and whilst this was considerably under 50%, he drew attention to the newly appointed Cabinet, where 4 out of the 6 members were female. He added that 4 members of the Council were aged under 35 years.

Members noted that female employees at South Norfolk earned slightly more than male colleagues, with the median gender pay gap being 14% in favour of females. He advised that as the Council employed over 250 employees, it was obliged to publish an Annual Equalities Statement which outlined how committed the Council was to equal opportunities.

Mrs V Clifford-Jackson referred Cllr Fuller to a recent Thriving Index survey, which placed South Norfolk fourth in Norfolk for Quality of Life, and she asked him whether he would wish to improve on this performance.

Cllr Fuller explained that he was not familiar with the Thriving Places index; he was more familiar with the widely publicised Halifax Quality of Life survey, where South Norfolk was ranked first in both Norfolk and Suffolk. He added that the Council had a really good performance management reporting system, with appropriate targets and monitoring in place and he explained that all members were encouraged to work together as part of the business planning and budget processes.

In response to a query from Cllr S Ridley, Cllr Bendle was pleased to report that since opening on 18 March, the refurbishment of the Long Stratton Leisure Centre had impacted positively on membership and income. The Centre now hosted a number of clubs, such as gymnastics and martial arts, a newly formed dementia club, and was part of the GP referral scheme. Membership was increasing daily and footfall had doubled from that what it was two years ago. The new café and soft play area were also attracting new visitors and additional income, and there had also been an increase in the number of children's parties being booked at the

Centre. Cllr Bendle reminded members that this was not just about income, but that the Centre was positively contributing to the health and wellbeing of residents in Long Stratton and the surrounding area.

Cllr T Spruce asked Cllr L Neal to report on progress regarding the recent unauthorised encampment of the travelling community on Whitlingham Lane, in Trowse. Cllr Neal was pleased to report that the issue had been quickly resolved following meetings with the Housing Standards and Community Protection Manager from South Norfolk, relevant officers from Norfolk County Council and the Gypsy and Traveller Forum.

(b) Annual Report of the Scrutiny Committee

Members noted the Annual Report of the Scrutiny Committee.

The Chairman of the Scrutiny Committee, Cllr G Minshull, paid tribute to the former Vice-Chairman of the Committee, Mr T Lewis, explaining that his input was always valued and would be missed. He looked forward to working with the new Vice-Chairman, Cllr V Clifford-Jackson.

(c) Annual Report of the Finance, Resources, Audit and Governance Committee 2018/19

The Chairman of the Finance, Resources, Audit and Governance Committee, Cllr P Hardy, presented the Annual Report, which outlined the work of the Committee during 2018.

Members noted that the Council had recently received notice from the external auditors, Ernst Young, that due to resource issues, it would not be able to undertake the Council's audit of accounts to meet the sign-off deadline of 31 July. The accounts would therefore not be audited until late Summer.

RESOLVED: To approve the Annual Report of the Finance Resources Audit and Governance Committee

(d) Licensing Appeals and Complaints Committee / Licensing and Gambling Acts Committee

There were no questions to the Chairman of the Licensing Committee.

3502 OUTSIDE BODIES – FEEDBACK FROM REPRESENTATIVES

Members noted the report regarding the Norfolk Police and Crime Panel, from former Councillor, Dr C Kemp. Cllr R Savage, the substitute member on that body, expressed his support for paragraph 3 of the report, which explained that district councils were being encouraged to invite the Police and Crime Commissioner to attend a meeting of that authority. He hoped that South Norfolk would be inviting the Commissioner to a future meeting.

Cllr K Mason Billig paid tribute to Dr Kemp's service to the Council, referring to him as a great asset to South Norfolk Council. Cllr V Clifford-Jackson echoed these comments and had always found him to be even handed and respectful of all members.

On behalf of his father, Cllr W Kemp thanked members for their kind words.
