To ensure that any constraints are recognised, it will be referenced in the Site Allocation Area Policy <u>LNGS1</u> to require that:
AM6	14	Paragraph 1.48	<i>Amend second sentence of existing paragraph 1.48:</i> The charging schedules were examined in October 2012. The residential levy is set at £50 per m² <u>(index linked)</u> in the Outer Area which includes the area covered by this AAP.

AM12	39	Paragraph 8.1	<i>Amend existing paragraph 8.1, 2nd and 3^d sentences:</i> Within the Conservation Area there are some 54 <u>over 50</u> buildings listed as being of special architectural or historic interest, <u>plus more outside of the Conservation Area</u>. There are also a number of buildings, which, though not listed, are considered to be of townscape significance <u>in the 2013 Long Stratton Conservation Area Character Appraisal</u>. <i>Amend existing paragraph 8.1, 4th sentence:</i> Key focal points include the market place at the junction of The Street and Star Lane and the <u>grade I listed</u> 14th century St Mary's Church and surrounding churchyard.
