The end result was effectively adding in an additional 6 words to the Policy 1 comment in the Examiner's First Clarification note, so it says:

Planning is always a balance between harm and benefits and between different objectives. Although the steering group on behalf of the community would like to see Middle Field retained for its openness, some impact on this could be acceptable when balanced against overriding community benefits afforded by the provision of a new village hall or school.

In respect of the Examiner's Second Clarification note:

- The parish council has not approved any decision made by the steering group, although they have been kept updated/made aware of progress and had the opportunity to ask questions at each parish council meeting.

  The parish council agrees with the majority of the response, although voted to add in the additional 6 words in bold, as above.
