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Supported Accommodation

(General Support)

South Norfolk and Broadland District Councils work closely with a number of accommodation providers to ensure that people who seek housing advice from us can access appropriate supported accommodation in times of difficulty.

There are many supported housing providers working with people from various backgrounds and with a variety of support needs although all are designed to be short to medium-term accommodation intended to help their residents move-on to independent accommodation.

The list below is not exhaustive but does provide basic contact details for the supported accommodation providers we most frequently help people to access. Sanctuary Housing

Sanctuary operate three supported accommodation schemes in South Norfolk, two in Broadland and many more in neighbouring authorities. Sanctuary provide supported accommodation for single people who are either homeless or unsuitably housed and provide resettlement support to enable residents to successfully move-on, when ready, to independent accommodation. They aim to work in a way that enables people to achieve their individual goals, at their own pace, in their own communities.

Wilkinson House (for men)

Wilkinson House is based in Wymondham and managed by Homegroup. They provide supported accommodation for single men aged 18-60, including ex-offenders. A key worker system means support is provided for daily living skills, family issues, employment, education and training as well as budgeting. There is a planned resettlement programme to help residents move to independent accommodation when they are ready.

Solo Supported Housing

Solo Housing have a well-developed supported housing project in Diss. Their scheme aims to enable people to develop skills for independent living and to assist people in seeking move-on accommodation.

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Solo's accommodation includes a hostel, bedsit flats and self-contained move-on flats and are suitable for applicants with low to medium support needs.

House of Genesis (for men)

House of Genesis provide accommodation on a short term basis (up to 2 years) for 16 adult men in our four homes. The project provides family-type accommodation, where men can receive care and support to help them back into the community and to achieve independence. House of Genesis also offer help and support with complex and personal issues and aim to build up self-esteem and self-confidence.

Forward Court – Benjamin foundation

Forward Court in Aylsham provides supported accommodation for seven young homeless people age 16 to 24. Each young person has their own fully furnished flat, designed to give them the opportunity to gain the skills necessary to manage their own tenancy independently, which is the long-term aim of the service. They also have the use of a lounge and a fully equipped kitchen, where

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they can socialise and be supported in practical cooking skills. Each young person is allocated a key worker who offers tailored support in areas including education, training, employment, daily life skills, and inclusion in the local community.

Hinde House (for women)

Managed by Orwell Housing, Hinde House provides women with a safe, manageable and comfortable home with the support they need to enable them to make choices and decisions about the way they live. Hinde House is a project specifically for women aged 16-40 who are homeless or unsuitably housed and can also accept applicants with mental health or substance misuse issues.

Hinde House also have 9 move-on flats and a well-established move-on and resettlement service.

Archway (for women)

Archway provide supported accommodation for single homeless or inadequately housed young women aged 16-24 with support needs. The service can be accessed by self-referrals or referrals through an agency and the average stay is between 6 months and 2 years. Archway have a keywork

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system with weekly meetings. Support plans with agreed outcomes, reviewed three-monthly. Staff provide support around independent living skills, personal care, access to education and training.

Bishopbridge House

Bishopbridge House is a direct access hostel in Norwich with 30+ bed spaces and a comprehensive support and move-on service. They can also accept people with dogs. Stays at Bishopbridge are short and those who are street homeless are prioritised. Demand on the service is high and it is often necessary to present to the hostel or contact them on a daily basis (before 4pm) to secure accommodation.

YMCA Norfolk

YMCA have a range of supported accommodation for 16-25 year olds, including an assessment and accommodation centre at YMCA Central, Norwich, a small number of Supported Lodgings spaces within a family environment and even short term emergency accommodation with families through their NightStop scheme.

The YMCA Central comprises 34 en-suite single bed-sitting rooms, training rooms, communal sitting rooms, staff rooms, offices, launderette, restaurant and training kitchen. This accommodation gives

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housing related support, life skills support and resettlement and aims to prepare its residents for independent living. The support also includes help to find longer-term sustainable accommodation for move-on.

The Supported Lodgings scheme provides young adults with accommodation in a home environment, with the aim of helping the lodger gain the confidence and skills they will need to become independent. The supported lodgings scheme offers young people their own room, some meals and a lot of security and support

Umbrella (for lone parents)

YMCA Norfolk also run Umbrella Housing, supported accommodation for single parent families (of all genders). Umbrella provides accommodation which is safe and supportive, with housing related support and tenant involvement opportunities. Accommodation is in self-contained properties which include a mix of houses and flats, providing 1, 2 & 3 bedroomed accommodation. A Housing Engagement Worker manages the properties ensuring housing management and maintenance issues are dealt with and trained volunteers offer additional support. A 24-hour service is available through the YMCA out-of-hours service for tenants reporting housing issues.

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Empanda

Empanda Care & Support is a Community Interest Company that offers community-based housing related support, residential respite care and domiciliary care services across Norfolk and day care services across Norfolk and Suffolk. Empanda provides a range of person centred, outcome focussed care and support services for vulnerable people and has three supported housing projects working with homeless young people across North Norfolk. All of their supported accommodation is temporary, and each scheme has a small staff team who are there to help young people gain independence and to get ready to move on into more independent accommodation.

Evolve

Evolve is a Community Interest Company set up to help a range of vulnerable people. Originally the focus of their work was with children, their families and care leavers. 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Phoenix House

Phoenix House provides supported housing for young single people between the ages of 16-25. Their accommodation consists of 21 single occupancy bedrooms, some with en-suite facilities. Other facilities include a communal lounge and dining room, IT Suite and gym. The Centre provides 3 meals a day; a self service breakfast and 2 freshly prepared meals. Residents are encouraged and supported to take up education, training and employment. Phoenix House works closely with a number of providers and local initiatives including the Prince's Trust, the Yard Project, Lowestoft College and Connexions.

Staff at Phoenix House actively encourage service users to socialise with one another and provide a variety of activities to facilitate this including; cookery classes, quiz nights, movie nights and pool competitions.

Emmaus

Emmaus is different from some of the other schemes on this list as it offers a home for as long as someone needs it, as well as meaningful work in their social enterprises. This is intended to be an opportunity to become part of a community and make a contribution to it. Emmaus residents are referred to as “Companions” living in an Emmaus community and working in the social enterprise, where they support themselves and one another. Emmaus social enterprises generate revenue that pays for companions’ home, food and upkeep, as well as providing a small weekly allowance. Most Emmaus schemes offer between 20 and 40 places for people to live.

Emmaus companions get a room of their own, food, clothing and a small weekly allowance and in return:

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- are asked to work for 40 hours per week, or give as much time as they are able, in the community's social enterprise
- must behave in a respectful way towards one another
- must not use alcohol or illegal drugs on the premises
- are asked to sign off all benefits, with the exception of housing benefit

- **Norfolk Community Law Service (NCLS):** NCLS aims to identify unmet legal need in Norfolk and to work with partner agencies to provide free services to meet that need. They aim to

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provide access to justice and equality and particularly target services at disadvantaged and vulnerable groups such as offenders, migrant workers and people with mental health issues.

Services include:

- twice weekly Free Legal Advice drop in service for employment, family & general advice; also similar services at Cromer and Great Yarmouth
- debt advice for vulnerable people and those with complex needs
- welfare benefits advice and representation at Tribunal
- legal advice for victims of domestic abuse
- Migrant Worker advice on residency status & entitlement for EEA Nationals as well as support for welfare benefit appeals
- discrimination advice and representation
- family court support for private law child contact matters
