If members wish to be provided with additional written evidence, this should be notified to the Senior Governance Officer as soon as practically possible, and preferentially at least 3 clear days before the meeting.

There are occasions where Scrutiny Committee may review a policy or decision before it is made by Cabinet or a delegated officer. Such decisions should not be called in unless members provide a statement in the call-in clearly identifying why the matters related to the call-in could not have been discussed within the previous scrutiny review.

Decisions which are not expressly called in under the provisions of the suspensive callin procedure will be deemed to have been a request for further information.
