DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AT MEETINGS

When declaring an interest at a meeting Members are asked to indicate whether their interest in the matter is pecuniary, or if the matter relates to, or affects a pecuniary interest they have, or if it is another type of interest. Members are required to identify the nature of the interest and the agenda item to which it relates. In the case of other interests, the member may speak and vote. If it is a pecuniary interest, the member must withdraw from the meeting when it is discussed. If it affects or relates to a pecuniary interest the member has, they have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public but must then withdraw from the meeting. Members are also requested when appropriate to make any declarations under the Code of Practice on Planning and Judicial matters.

If yes, you need to inform the meeting. When it is discussed, you will have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public, but must then withdraw from the meeting.

Purpose of the Report:	To determine a full variation application for the Norfolk Showground, Dereham Road, Costessey

Recommendations:

The Sub-Committee is expected to make its determination based on an assessment of the evidence on both the risks and benefits for or against making the determination, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

The Sub-Committee must make its determination within the period of five working days beginning with the day or the last day on which the hearing was held.

Where a licensing authority determines an application, it must notify the determination and its reason of making it to -

- (a) The holder of the licence
- (b) The applicant
- (c) Any person who has made relevant representations, and
- (d) The chief office of police for the police area in which the premises are situated

1. SUMMARY

- **1.1** The purpose of this report is to determine a full variation application that has been made by the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Association for a full variation application for the Norfolk Showground, Dereham Road, Costessey. A relevant representation has been made regarding this application.
- **1.2** Given the above, the application must be determined by a hearing of the Licensing and Gambling Acts Sub-Committee.
- **1.3** In determining the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community, the Sub-Committee must give appropriate weight to:
 - The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives;
 - The representations presented by all parties;
 - The revised guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003;
 - South Norfolk Council's Statement of Licensing Policy published in January 2016
- **1.4** The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of public nuisance;
 - The protection of children from harm;

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 South Norfolk Council is the authority responsible for issuing licences within the district under the Licensing Act 2003, which came into effect on the 24th November 2005.
- 2.2 Since the Licensing Act 2003 came into effect, further legislative amendments have been made through the Live Music Act 2012 and the Deregulation Act 2015.
- 2.3 An application was made on the 25th January 2019 by the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Association following an approach by the Licensing Authority. The Royal Norfolk Showground has been operating under a premises licence PLA0273 (attached as Appendix 3) for the buildings and a grid reference temporary event notice system for the remainder of the site. This permitted the submission of multiple temporary event notices exceeding the statutory 15 per calendar year to enable events such as the Royal Norfolk Show. However, following a review of the Licensing Authority procedures and in consultation with NPLaw it was agreed that a full variation of premises licence PLA0273 to prevent the submission of multiple temporary event notices was required.
- 2.4 The application form is attached as Appendix 1 and site plans showing the existing licensable areas and proposed licensable areas are attached as Appendix 2.
- 2.5 The application requests to extend the licensable area to the boundary of the site to permit the provision of live and recorded music, anything of a similar description, late night refreshment and the supply of alcohol to take place outdoors as well as indoors.
- 2.6 In addition, the application requests to increase the capacity in attendance, removal/addition/amendment of conditions contained under the operating schedule and amendment to the timings for the following provisions: -

Opening Hours

Extension to operating hours on Fridays & Saturdays from 09:00 – 03:00 the following day on 6 occasions per year and New Years Eve to be held within the Arena building only.

Indoor Sporting Events

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 00:00

Boxing or Wrestling Entertainments (indoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 00:00

Live Music (indoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 01:00

Extension to operating hours on Fridays and Saturdays from 09:00 – 03:00 the following day on 6 occasions per year and New Year's Eve to be held within the Arena Building only.

Live Music (outdoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 23:00

No amplified music played in any of the temporary structures after 23:00 on any occasion except for up to 4 events in any calendar year when amplified music shall be permitted until 01:00. Notification of these events will be provided to the LA at least 7 working days prior to the event.

Recorded Music (indoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 01:00

Extension to operating hours on Fridays and Saturdays from 09:00 – 03:00 the following day on 6 occasions per year and New Year's Eve to be held within the Arena Building only.

Recorded Music (outdoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 23:00

No amplified music played in any of the temporary structures after 23:00 on any occasion except for up to 4 events in any calendar year when amplified music shall be permitted until 01:00. Notification of these events will be provided to the LA at least 7 working days prior to the event.

Performances of Dance (indoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 00:00

Anything of a similar description (indoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 01:00

Extension to operating hours on Fridays and Saturdays from 09:00 – 03:00 the following day on 6 occasions per year and New Year's Eve to be held within the Arena Building only.

Anything of a similar description (outdoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 23:00

Late Night Refreshment (indoors & outdoors)

Mon-Sun 23:00 – 01:00

Supply of alcohol (on & off the premises) (indoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 00:30

Extension to operating hours on Fridays and Saturdays from 09:00 – 02:30 the following day on 6 occasions per year and New Year's Eve to be held within the Arena Building only.

Supply of alcohol (outdoors)

Mon-Sun 09:00 – 23:00

- 2.7 Following the statutory consultation, a representation was received from the Planning Department raising no objection. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 4.
- 2.8 A representation was received from the Licensing Team at Norfolk Constabulary raising no objection. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 5.
- 2.9 A representation was received from Easton Parish Council supporting the application. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 6.
- 2.10 A representation was received from Costessey Town Council raising objections under each of the licensing objectives. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 7.

3. CURRENT POSITION / FINDINGS

3.1 Further discussions took place between the applicants Solicitors, Howes Percival (within the consultation period) and Costessey Town Council (outside of the consultation period). I am attaching copies to this report for reference at Appendix 8.

4. PROPOSED ACTION

4.1 The application must be determined by a hearing of the Licensing and Gambling Acts Sub-Committee, as under the Act, determination may not be delegated to officer level. This determination should only be made in relation to the received representation relevant to the content of this application, the four licensing objectives, the Revised Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and South Norfolk Council's Statement of Licensing Policy published in January 2016.

5. OTHER OPTIONS

5.1 The authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps mentioned below (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The steps are –

- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
- (b) to reject the whole or part of the application;

and for this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

5.2 Conditions on a premises licence are important in setting the parameters within which premises can lawfully operate. The use of wording such as "must", "shall" and "will" is encouraged.

Licence conditions:

- must be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives;
- must be precise and enforceable;
- must be unambiguous and clear in what they intend to achieve;
- should not duplicate other statutory requirements or other duties or responsibilities placed on the employer by other legislation;
- must be tailored to the individual type, location and characteristics of the premises and events concerned;
- should not be standardised and may be unlawful when it cannot be demonstrated that they are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in an individual case;
- should not replicate offences set out in the 2003 Act or other legislation;
- should be proportionate, justifiable and be capable of being met;
- cannot seek to manage the behaviour of customers once they are beyond the direct management of the licence holder and their staff, but may impact on the behaviour of customers in the immediate vicinity of the premises or as they enter or leave; and
- should be written in a prescriptive format.
- 5.2 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days.

- 1. Extension of the licensable area as shown on the attached plan.
- 2. Removal of conditions 1 & 2 under Annex 2 of the Operating Schedule and replacement with the following:

The maximum number of people, including staff, that can attend the area of the licenced premises at any one time must not exceed 49,999 in total provided that events contained or using any buildings shown on the licence plan (including within any temporary structures erected in the licensable area) shall not exceed the occupancy figure for those buildings for events determined by fire risk assessments completed for those events.

3. Removal of condition 10 under Annex 2 of the Operating Schedule and replacement with the following:

The premises licence holder will consult with the South Norfolk Safety Advisory Group on all events involving more than 500 people or where they feel the proposed event may have a detrimental impact on local residents and/or businesses. The premises licence holder will comply to any additional conditions agreed between the event organiser, premises licence holder and Safety Advisory Group members.

4. Removal of condition 15 under Annex 2 of the Operating Schedule and replacement with following:

No glass drinking vessels or glass bottles shall be permitted outside of the Showground Arena, St Walstan Hall or Pavilions. This condition shall not apply to the use of glass drinking vessels outside of these areas (including in temporary structures) in connection with a meal taken at a table by patrons who are seated in an area set aside exclusively for patrons taking table meals.

- 5. Removal of condition 18 under Annex 2 of the Operating Schedule as it duplicates condition 26.
- 6. Removal of condition 20 under Annex 2 of the Operating Schedule and replacement with the following:

Fire detection and alarm systems in permanent buildings are maintained and tested by Norfolk Showground Ltd. Where permanent buildings are to be used for licensable events the alarm systems in that permanent building shall be tested before and after each event.

7. Removal of condition 24 under Annex 2 of the Operating Schedule and replacement with the following:

Unless other arrangements are agreed with the Licensing Authority, no parking for any of the licensable events at the Showground is to take place on any of the highways open to the public or on any highway verges immediately adjoining highways open to the public around the perimeter of the licensable area during the carrying on of licensable activities on the Showground.

8. Removal of condition 28 under Annex 2 of the Operating Schedule and replacement with the following:

Noise levels from all licensable activities comprising of regulated entertainment will be monitored and controlled by the Premises Licence Holder through a condition of hire so as not to give rise to a nuisance to any residential premises.

9. Removal of condition 31 under Annex 2 of the Operating Schedule and replacement with the following:

Access and egress to the premises is controlled and gates are permanently manned when licensable activities are being carried on at the premises during operating hours. Gates may be locked overnight. No patrons will be allowed to leave the premises while in the possession of any drinking vessel or open glass bottle, whether empty or containing any beverage. ANNEX 1- MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Mandatory Conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

General

- 1. The maximum number of people that can attend the licences premises areas at anyone time must not exceed 5,000 in total.
- 2. The Premises Licence will include any temporary structure such as a marquee, tent, canopy or similar which is attached to the permanent licensed buildings with the exception of the two days of the Royal Norfolk Show within the Summer Pavilion area where a structure may be erected and included in the licence so long as it is within 10 metres in distance of the licensed building. The temporary structures will not exceed 100 metres in length and width. In most cases, the limit of 100 metres will not be possible due to permanent structures (such as toilet facilities, other buildings) which will prohibit this extension. Where possible, the temporary structure will have a roof/cover and sides to define the area.
- 3. All event organisers using the showground are to produce suitable and sufficient risk assessments covering the four licensing objectives. These will then be compared against the conditions of the licence. Permission for event to proceed will be granted on this basis.
- 4. A Duty Officer, will use a "checklist" system to ensure compliance with the terms of the licence and monitor all events.
- 5. A log will be maintained by Norfolk Showground Ltd recording all incidents.
- 6. Fire Evacuation plans to be displayed in all permanent buildings.
- 7. All event organizers will be responsible for the completion of Fire Risk assessments for each building in relation to the activities being carried out.
- 8. Suitable welfare facilities are provided on-site and to be made available at all events.
- 9. Norfolk Showground Ltd will make available a satisfactory:
 - NICEIC periodic electrical annual inspection report.
 - A CORGI certificate in respect of any gas boiler.
 - A certificate of inspection for portable fire-fighting equipment.
 - A record of inspections for fire detection alarm systems.
- 10. The premises licence holder will consult with the Safety Advisory Group on events they feel appropriate and will comply with conditions agreed between the premises licence holder and the

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 11. Risk assessments will be made available for all events. These are to include audience profiles and crowd dynamics in relation to the venue on the Showground.
- 12. All events are to have an adequate number of stewards available that have sufficient training, knowledge and experience in the type of event being held. If a temporary structure is used joining the building, extra security will be available, depending on numbers.
- 13. Where appropriate, and depending on the outcome of the completed risk assessment the emergency service will be consulted and suitable provisions made for their involvement at the event.
- 14. Where needed, suitable lighting will be made available by the event organiser and will include lighting at both access and egress points.
- 15. When dispensing drinks, it is recommended to use plastic glasses as the preferred option. However, an exception can be made for the more 'formal sit down meal'.

Public Safety

- 16. Risk assessments are to be completed for all events held on the showground.
- 17. All event organisers are to make available where applicable:
 - Suitable and sufficient risk assessment.
 - Electrical inspection reports certificates (temporary).
 - · Fire alarm test inspection reports.
 - Fire fighting equipment.
 - · Certificates of flame retardant materials for marquees.
 - Emergency procedures.
 - Certificates relating to the design, construction and loading capacities of temporary structures (seating, stages etc). A structural engineer to check.
 - Traffic management plans.
 - Public liability insurance.
- 18. Refuse will be removed at regular intervals preventing health of fire hazards.
- 19. First-aid facilities will be made available by the event organiser and the provision of medical, ambulance and first-aid will be in accordance with the guidance in the Event Safety Guide.
- 20. Fire detection and alarm systems in permanent buildings are maintained and tested by Norfolk Showground Ltd. Alarm systems are to be tested before and after each event.
- 21. Barriers are available to restrict access or segregate patrons from perceived hazards.

22. That the number of stewards and provision for welfare issues at an event will be decided by conducting a risk assessment which takes into account relevant guidance in the HSE Event Safety Guide.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

23. Norfolk Showground Ltd will assess all events on their merits and hours of operation will be determined appropriately.

- 24. Adequate car parking is available at the showground and should not affect local residence.
- 25. Sufficient receptacles will be provided for refuse storage.
- 26. Refuse is removed at regular intervals as not to create health or fire hazards.
- 27. The Licensee will ensure that at least 14 days prior to any event that compromises the playing of amplified live music indoors or the playing of amplified recorded music either indoors or outdoors, the name and contact number for the person responsible for the management and monitoring of noise levels at the event shall be forwarded to the Licensing Authority.

28. Noise levels from all licensable activities will be monitored and controlled by the Premises Licence Holder through a condition of hire, so as not to be a nuisance at any residential premise.

29. A condition of hire will include the need for certain event organisers to produce a Noise Management Plan. The need for such a plan will be determined by the Safety Advisory Group.

30. There is limited permanent lighting on the Showground. Consideration will be given to the necessity of lighting; its location and duration of use.

31. Access and egress is controlled and gates are permanently manned. No alcohol, bottles glasses etc are allowed off-site.

32. Pyrotechnics and fireworks will be permitted no more than 4 times per annum falling between 1 June to 2 January.

33. All activities are self-contained within the confines of the showground.

34. That no amplified music is played in any of the temporary structures after 22.00 hours on any occasion except for up to 4 events in any calendar year when amplified music shall be permitted until 01.00 hours. Notification of these events is to be provided in writing to the Licensing Authority (Licensing Team) at least 7 working days prior to the event.

The Protection of Children from Harm

35. Norfolk Showground Ltd has a lost children procedure in place and children are tagged for ease of repatriation. This service is available to other hirers of the showground.

- 36. Guidance exists for organisers using the showground on the correct use of public address systems in relation to lost children.
- 37. Suitable provision is made for visiting groups and for any children involved in performances.
- 38. Children performing in productions will be kept under adult supervision at all times.
- 39. No children will be served with alcohol and proof of age will be needed.

ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING COMMITTEE

- 1. In relation to the extension of hours for 6 occasions per year plus New Years Eve to be held in the Exhibition Hall.
- 2. The Police and South Norfolk Environmental Protection Team are notified in writing of the extension of hours under the 6 occasions per year, at least 6 weeks in advance.
- 3. No events shall be held within the exhibition hall where outside WCs and bars are used by patrons between the hours of 01:00am and 09:00am.
- 4. The extension will apply for no more than 2 days within any 14 day period.
- 5. During events, all external doors are to be monitored by SIA approved stewards and are to be kept closed whilst music is being played other than for access and egress through the main entrance doors.

Costessey TC OBJECTS to the Variation in the Showground Licence on the following grounds: The prevention of crime and disorder: Extending the hours will lead to further issues - problems so far reported are previous events where students had spilled out onto the road as they were under the influence of drink / drugs, causing a danger to themselves and road users. Many individual events had to pay for their own TENS licence to which conditions could be attached, so potential issues could be controlled. This variation would not allow individual events to be assessed or conditions to be imposed to control possible crime & disorder.

Public Safety: Extending the hours will lead to further issues - problems so far reported are previous events where students had spilled out onto the road as they were under the influence of drink / drugs. causing a danger to themselves and road users.

Prevention of Public Nuisance: Residents throughout Costessey regularly hear the events at the Showground. The music is often unbelievable loud. The variation would extend timings / hours of events to 3am without adequate noise control, eg a requirement for a silent disco. The Town Council often receives complaints about the unbearably loud music at Showground events, which prevents residents sleeping properly. A silent disco after 1am should be a condition at all events. The protection of children from harm: Extending the hours will lead to further issues and make it more likely that children will not be kept safe from alcohol, drugs, noise damage to their ears, sleep deprivation. Premises licence variation: Norfolk Showground, Dereham Road, Norwich

We act for the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Association ("RNAA") in relation to the above matter.

Background

- 1 The RNAA made an application to vary its premises licence (PLA0273) ("**Current Licence**") for the Norfolk Showground ("**Showground**") on 31 January 2019 ("**Variation Application**").
- 2 The Variation Application sought to extend the licensable area, amend timings for certain licensable activities, amend a number of licensing conditions and remove and add further licensing conditions.
- 3 We have been made aware of an objection to the Variation Application on 28 February 2019. A copy of the email setting out these objections is enclosed.

Our client's position

- 4 Our client has been holding events on the Norfolk Showground since 1954.
- 5 Our client has always taken its responsibilities under the relevant Licensing Acts seriously and continues to do so. In particular, the RNAA is particularly keen to ensure that the operation of licensable activities on the Showground continues to promote the four licensing objectives set out in the Licensing Act 2003.
- 6 In this regard, the RNAA carefully considered its responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 and the licensing objectives before preparing and submitting the Variation Application. The RNAA has worked closely with South Norfolk Council ("**Council**") to ensure that the varied licence that may be granted pursuant to the Variation Application is made subject to a number of licensing conditions which restrict and regulate the carrying on of licensable



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activities on the Showground to make sure the carrying on of events continues to promote the four licensing objectives. This has included the RNAA suggesting a number of new and varied licensing conditions which are discussed in further detail below.

- 7 The RNAA is willing to discuss any concerns that the objector has directly with the objector if the objector is content to do so. In the event that the objector does not withdraw their objection we would welcome sight of the actual representation that has been made and confirmation of the identity of the objector in advance of any hearing.
- 8 Turning to the specific concerns of the objector, we wish to clarify that the Variation Application does not seek to extend the overall hours for which licensable activities may be carried on at the Showground. In the event that the Variation Application is granted the licensable activities at the Showground will cease at 01:00 at the very latest (with a number of licensable activities required to cease before this time) save for six occasions per year and New Year's Eve where an extension to these hours is permitted. This is the case in the Current Licence.
- 9 The RNAA consider it is important to maintain the flexibility to extend the hours of operation of licensable activities on the Showground on a few limited occasions per year from an operational perspective. However, in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives the RNAA has suggested a licensing condition to ensure that the Parish/Town Councils for Costessey, Bawburgh and Easton will be notified in writing 2 weeks in advance of any proposed extension of hours under such non-standard timings.
- 10 A comment has also been made by the objector that the Varied Licence would not allow individual events to be assessed or conditions to be imposed to control possible crime and disorder. This is something that the RNAA have considered and to address this it is proposed that any premises licence granted pursuant to the Variation Application is subject to a range of conditions which regulate the operation of events on an individual basis. Such conditions include the following:
 - 10.1 A requirement to consult the South Norfolk Advisory Group on all events involving more than 500 people or where they feel the proposed event may have a detrimental impact on local residents and/or businesses;
 - 10.2 Fire detection and alarm systems will need to be tested before and after each event;
 - 10.3 For each and every licensable event, the licence holder must ensure that a contact telephone number for resident complaints is provided on their website for the duration of the event;
 - 10.4 All event organisers using the showground are required to produce suitable and sufficient risk assessments covering each of the four licensing objectives compared against the provisions of the licence and permission for the event to proceed is on this basis;
 - 10.5 Risk assessments must be made available for all events and must include audience profiles and crowd dynamics in relation to the venue. Where appropriate following these risk assessments the emergency service must be consulted and provision made for their involvement in the event; and
 - 10.6 All events are required to have an adequate number of stewards available to have sufficient training, knowledge and experience in the type of event being held and

extra security must be available if temporary structures adjoining buildings are used, depending on numbers.

- 11 We hope that the objector will appreciate that the RNAA has taken its responsibilities seriously here and that any premises licence granted pursuant to the Variation Application will include requirements that will ensure that individual events continue to be considered on their own merits which will allow any "event specific" issues to be addressed.
- 12 The objector has also indicated that there have been problems reported in relation to students spilling out onto the road following events. The RNAA has been notified of an isolated incident which occurred on the weekend of the 9th and 10th February 2019 in relation to people leaving the Showground following an event. The organiser of that event has been invited to attend the Council's Safety Advisory Group meeting on 4 April 2019 and we will require the operator of this event to do so in order to address any concerns and ensure that future events run without incident, as they have done numerous times in the past.
- 13 The RNAA are keen to ensure the safe and orderly exit of customers from the Showground and in this regard has already suggested to the Council that any premises licence granted pursuant to the Variation Application is subject to a licensing condition which requires access and egress to the Showground to be controlled and gates to be permanently manned when licensable activities are being carried on at the Showground.
- 14 The objection that we have seen also includes concerns regarding noise. As set out above, the Current Licence authorises the extension of hours for licensable activities on a limited amount of times per calendar year and only subject to licensing conditions. It is not the intention of the RNAA to increase the amount of activities which are carried on beyond 01:00 in excess of those already authorised by the Current Licence.
- 15 However and in any event, the RNAA continues to take the promotion of the licensing objective to prevent public nuisance seriously. In this regard, the RNAA have suggested the imposition of a licensing condition requiring noise levels from all licensable activities comprising of regulated entertainment to be monitored and controlled through a condition of hire so this does not give rise to nuisance to any residential premises. A further licencing condition shall require the production of a Noise Management Plan for certain events as determined through the Council's safety advisory group. If nuisance does arise the licensing authority would be able to take appropriate steps to ensure this condition is complied with.
- 16 In addition, the RNAA have also suggested a further licensing condition to ensure that no amplified music is played in any temporary structures after 23:00 on any occasion except for four events in a calendar year when such amplified music is permitted until 01:00 and where the notification of such events must be given in writing to the licensing authority at least 7 working days before that event.
- 17 Furthermore, a further licensing condition which is present on the Current Licence and will be imposed on any premises licence granted pursuant to the Variation Application shall require all external doors to be monitored by SIA approved stewards during events and to be kept closed whilst music is being played (other than access and egress through the main doors).
- 18 A number of the points set out above also apply to the promotion of the licensing objective to protect children from harm. In addition to these points, any licence granted subject to the Variation Application shall include licensing conditions which are present on the Current Licence to ensure that age verification procedures are in place in terms of the purchase of alcohol and a lost children procedure is in place for the Showground.

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Next steps

- 19 We hope that this letter has made it clear that the RNAA take its responsibilities as a premises licence holder extremely seriously and have carefully considered its obligations before making the Variation Application.
- 20 In light of the points made above, we hope that the objector is willing to withdraw their objection. In the event that the objector does not wish to withdraw their objection at this stage we would welcome an opportunity to meet with them to discuss their concerns.

I have had the following comments from Councillors:

"Two points:

in 10.3 re Phone number: I feel this number must be manned all the time the event is in progress, not an answer machine. Also as not everyone has access to internet, especially in middle of the night, this number should be displayed on all advertising for the event so it is readily available to everyone.

in 15. they mention monitoring of noise, but when calls are made how quickly will these complaints be dealt with, no good saying they will be investigated, which usually means the following day, but need to be dealt with immediately.

<u>Also extending the area</u> the licence will cover brings it closer to the new properties on Lodge Farm, only the width of A47 separating them.

As for the length of time they have held events on the Showground, it has only been the last 5-10 years they have had the music which is the main cause for complaint".

"Reiterate our concerns and confirm our objection when this was brought up at full council. They should conform to every other licensing application from other agents rather than applying for a blanket exception in their case.

Noise, nuisance, disturbance after 1pm is the big concern"

<u>Cllr G Blundell:</u> I'd be happy to have a chat about why it shouldn't be extended; it is nothing to do with the RNAA, but more with allowing outside companies to use this licence and not apply for their own, which every other organisation does. I have looked back regarding the comment about a number for residents to call for noise complaints, and I cannot find one on the Dancing Astronauts page regarding this number **which is supposed to be a stipulation of the licence**
