### **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AT MEETINGS**

When declaring an interest at a meeting Members are asked to indicate whether their interest in the matter is pecuniary, or if the matter relates to, or affects a pecuniary interest they have, or if it is another type of interest. Members are required to identify the nature of the interest and the agenda item to which it relates. In the case of other interests, the member may speak and vote. If it is a pecuniary interest, the member must withdraw from the meeting when it is discussed. If it affects or relates to a pecuniary interest the member has, they have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public but must then withdraw from the meeting. Members are also requested when appropriate to make any declarations under the Code of Practice on Planning and Judicial matters.

Have you declared the interest in the register of interests as a pecuniary interest? If Yes, you will need to withdraw from the room when it is discussed.

If it has not been previously declared, you will also need to notify the Monitoring Officer within 28 days.

Does the interest indirectly affect or relate any pecuniary interest you have already declared, or an interest you have identified at 1-5 above?


If yes, you need to inform the meeting. When it is discussed, you will have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public, but must then withdraw from the meeting.

## 1. Introduction

- The purpose of this report is to determine an application that has been made by Mr Michael Francis for a full variation of premises icence 18/01054 for Wymondham Sports Bar & Club, Town Green, Wymondham. Relevant representations have been made regarding this application. 7:
- Given the above, the application must be determined by a hearing of the Licensing and Gambling Acts Sub-Committee. 1.2
- In determining the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community, the Sub-Committee must give appropriate weight to: 1.3
  - The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives
    - The prevention of crime and disorder,
- Public safety;
- The prevention of public nuisance;
- The protection of children from harm
- The representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties
  - The Revised Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003
- South Norfolk Council's Statement of Licensing Policy published in January 2016

## 2. Background

- South Norfolk Council is the authority responsible for issuing licences within the district under the Licensing Act 2003, which came into effect on the 24th November 2005. 2.1
- Since the Licensing Act 2003 came into effect, further legislative amendments have been made through the Live Music Act 2012 and the Deregulation Act 2015. 2.2

## 3. Proposals

- Wymondham. The application form is attached as Appendix 1, with supporting documents attached as Appendix 2 and a location An application was made on the 29th October 2018 by Mr Michael Francis for Wymondham Sports Bar & Club, Town Green, plan is attached as Appendix 3. 3.1
- The application seeks to vary the premises licence 18/01054. A copy of the existing premises licence is attached as Appendix 4 for information purposes. 3.2

The application requests the following amendments: -

12:00 - 23:30Monday, Wednesday & Thursday Supply of alcohol - On the premises

Opening Hours

Monday, Wednesday & Thursday 12:00 – 00:00

The proposed additional timings only relate to home scheduled league matches of darts, poker and snooker.

The application also seeks to amend condition 1 under Annex 3 as follows -

The beer garden shall only be used until 23:30hrs

- A representation has been received from Wymondham Town Council raising no objections. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 5. 3.3
- A representation has been received from the Licensing Team at Norfolk Constabulary raising no objections. The Police have however suggested their preference regarding the smoking location. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 6. 3.4

- A representation has been received from the Planning Department advising a planning application has been received seeking to rectify the differences between the two acts. Therefore, no objections were raised. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 7. 3.5
- A representation has been received from Environmental Services requesting that the applicant submit a noise management plan within three months from the date of any variation being granted by the Licensing and Gambling Acts Sub Committee. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 8. 3.6
- Five letters of objection have been received from local residents with regard to the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime epresentations are attached as Appendix 9 and a map highlighting the location of properties for those residents raising and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance, the protection of children from harm and public safety. Copies of the objection is attached as Appendix 10. 3.7

# 4. Current Position/Findings

- The Revised Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 Section 9.45 states: -4.1
- "Where businesses have indicated, when applying for a licence under the 2003 Act, that they have also applied for planning permission or that they intend to do so, licensing committees and officers should consider discussion with their planning counterparts prior to determination with the aim of agreeing mutually acceptable operating hours and scheme designs.
- A copy of the relevant section of the Statement of Licensing Policy is attached as Appendix 11. 4.2

# Other options (if necessary)

The authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such of the steps mentioned below (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. 5.1

The steps are –

- (a) To grant the licence subject –
- to the conditions modified to such extent as the authority considers (appropriate) for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
- any conditions which must under sections 19, 20 or 21 of the Act be included on the licence;
- (b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
  - (c) To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
    - (d) To reject the licence
- There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days.

# 6. Recommendation

- The Sub-Committee is expected to make its determination based on an assessment of the evidence on both the risks and benefits for or against making the determination, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. 6.1
- The Sub-Committee must make its determination within the period of five working days beginning with the day or the last day on which the hearing was held. 6.2
- Where a licensing authority determines an application, it must notify the determination and its reason of making it to 6.3
  - (a) The holder of the licence(b) The applicant

- (c) Any person who has made relevant representations, and (d) The chief office of police for the police area in which the premises are situated

### **Notes for Guidance**

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

  - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
  - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
  - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a
    contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle
    wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
    audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined
    as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling
    with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling
    entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
  - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
    - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
    - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local

I write in order to confirm that the Community Protection Team has received two complaints this year concerning Wymondham Snooker Club, 1 Town Green, Wymondham.

The first complaint (our reference 18/14254/EPNN42) was received on the 26 May 2018 from a resident of Vicar Street and related to "noise from live bands every Saturday along with shouting by patrons". A letter was sent to the complainant informing them that we had raised this matter with Wymondham Snooker Club by letter. We further advised them that if the situation did not improve, and they wanted to continue with their complaint, to complete and return the noise monitoring diary sheets we supplied. On the 4 July 2018 we reviewed this case and it was closed it as the noise monitoring diary sheets had not been returned.

The second complaint (our reference 18/18552/EPNN42) was received on the July 2018 from two separate resident of Vicar Street and related to noise from functions/bands along with shouting by patrons. A letter was sent to the complainants informing them that we had raised this matter with Wymondham Snooker Club by letter. We further advised the complainants that if the situation did not improve, and they wanted to continue with their complaint, to complete and return the noise monitoring diary sheets we supplied. Following noise monitoring diary sheets being returned by one of the complainants, this matter was investigated further by a Community Protection Officer. The complaint was subsequently closed on the 19 September 2018 when the investigating officer concluded that his investigations did not prove a statutory noise nuisance to currently exist as a result of noise from Wymondham Snooker Club.



  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 6. The responsible person must ensure that -
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
  - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml;

For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 7. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

  - (a) duty is to be construed in accordance with the Alcohol Liquor Duties Act 1979;



I can confirm that Police have received a copy of the application for Wymondham Sports Bar to vary the licence.

This application has been applied for following a recent committee hearing which resulted in the licence being amended to reduce the impact of noise to local residents.

My understanding after speaking to the applicant is that the licence hours for midweek was reduced which has prevented the venue from hosting regular pool and darts leagues. The applicant is of the opinion that these events were never an issue to residents.

A further condition was imposed to close the rear beer garden at 2300 hrs. This has resulted in all patrons congregating at the front of the premises after this time.

There is no evidence from Police to suggest that the granting of these additional hours midweek will cause an impact to crime and disorder.

It is preferred by Police that patrons who wish to smoke outside are kept at the rear of the premises as this is segregated, controlled and takes away the risk of patrons clashing with passer-by's on the street. I do appreciate that these changes were made as a result of noise issues therefore it may be that Environmental Services at SNDC are best placed to comment with this.

In summary the Police have no objections to this application.

Further to our conversation last week concerning the application submitted by Mr Michael Francis who is the owner & licensee of the above premises to vary the condition restricting the use of the rear external seating area.

We have had complaints from residents living in the vicinity of the application premises. We have not so far substantiated those complaints and as a consequence we are not minded to object to this application. However, I would ask that Mr Francis submit a noise management plan within three-months from the date any variation of condition being granted by the Licensing Committee. This management place should detail how Mr Francis and his staff control noise from the premises. Mr Francis has already indicated to me directly some of the management controls he has put in place but these are not written down and so it shouldn't be too difficult for him to put a simple yet robust management plan together.

However, if Mr Francis fails to effectively manage noise from his premises and there is sufficient evidence to demonstrate residents are being adversely affected then we will consider calling a review of the premises license and / or take any other relevant action to control noise from the premises. I have already spoken to him already about this and he is aware of the consequences if he doesn't manage his premises responsibly.



Dear Rosie Setford,

I understand that another application has been made to the Licensing Committee in relation to the premises of Wymondham Sports Bar and Club.

I would wish, as previously, to oppose the applications.

I am the chair of the Vicar Street Homewatch Group, and as mentioned previously hear a lot of the concern and distress expressed by residents, many of them senior citizens who are regularly disturbed by the anit-social behaviour of the clients of the bar when they leave the premises. This regularly happens at weekends when the licensing hours are later. It is unreasonable to inflict such experiences on the residents of this street on three other days a week with alcohol served until 23.30 and the opening hours extended to 12.00. In understand the application only relates to certain fixtures but would clearly be a frequent occurrence.

Mr Francis is also applying for a revoking of the condition applying to the rear yard, which has repeatedly caused disturbance and unhappiness. Those leaving should be in the public street so the police can readily be called if necessary.

I stressed last time and underline again that this is a largely residential area and within a conservation area as one of the protected parts of the town.

I wish to object to the application for a variation of the licence to Wymondham Sport Bar.

It was only In July of this year Michael Francis, applied for the grant of a new premises licence in place of the Club Premises Certificate. Following a hearing before the South Norfolk Council in October, the licence was granted as applied for save that the terminal hours were restricted in relation to each of the licensable activities. In particular, this restricted the sale of alcohol by one hour for Mondays to Thursdays to 22:30 and the hours open to the public, by one hour Mondays to Thursdays to 23:00. The Committee also imposed conditions that the beer garden should only be used until 23:00; that notices should be erected asking customers to be respectful to neighbours and to leave the premises quietly.

Mr Francis is now making new application to vary the licence and extend his licencing hours just weeks after the original hearing and the requested variations are for the hours **originally applied for but not granted** following the committee's consideration of the representations made against them. It seems to me he ought instead to have appealed the committee's decision on grant of the licence. It also follows that the same concerns that were made in the representations on the original licence application therefore remain relevant in so far as they are still concerns.

The reason for the requested variation is said to be to comply with the regional pool, darts and poker leagues but I doubt these rules have changed since the last hearing.

Given that nothing has changed with regard to my objections since the hearing in October I will reiterate the main points here (my full objection is, I assume, still on record). I live across the road from the club and property is approximately 15 meters from the entrance to the promises. My objections are on the grounds of

- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm
- Public safety

#### Prevention of Public nuisance

Over the last year, the club has had numerous parties and social events that feature live and recorded music. The music often shakes the windows of my house and prevents my children from sleeping. Also, cliental spill out into the street to smoke, talk, argue and sometimes fight. This occurs directly in front of my house and under the window of my daughter's bedroom (now 13 years old). These events often play music after their licence and the club doesn't empty until way past midnight. When the club does empty, we often have more screaming and shouting and endless taxis running their engines outside our home. I have a nascence report reference number covering this problem (WEB-NUI-873).

#### Prevention of children from harm

I have two children at home (13 and 16 years old). My 13 year-old daughter's window looks out toward the club and down the alley that runs alongside it. Not only does the noise stop her sleeping but she gets to listen and to watch all of the activity that occurs outside. Including the arguments, fights and the people urinating or engaged in amorous encounters in the alley by the club (yes that happens as well). This is bad enough at weekends but the current application is requesting that this can happen all week. I have no doubt that his would have a genuine detrimental effect on my children's ability to get healthy sleep and to be able to perform at school.

#### **Public Safety**

On occasion, after these events I have the task of clearing up the up the broken glass from the pint glasses that have been disposed of against the wall of my house. Fortunately, I am not aware of anyone being hurt by this yet but I imagine it is only a matter of time.

I would like to add that sine the previous licence put a curfew on the use of the beer garden from 23:00 it now means that people living in front of the premises such as my family are disturbed by people making noise on the street front of the premises as this is now used as the outdoor smoking space. If the sale of alcohol is extended on these nights until 23:30 and the opening hours are extended until midnight (effectively giving a "drinking up" time until midnight), then this cause further noise and disturbance at the front of the premises. This is a particular problem for my youngest child who bedroom overlooks the pub. This noise would be unacceptable on school days.

I also have specific concerns about the validity of any licence that enables the club to open beyond its current planning. Peter Kerrison, Planning Technician at South Norfolk Council, stated in the agenda papers for the previous hearing, that the current planning permission does not allow operation of the premises between 11:30pm to 09:00am. This means that, if they are operating the premises beyond 11:30pm (which they will be if they use the opening hours they are applying for) they will be in breach of this condition. Therefore, the pub is already operating outside its planning during the weekends and it would seem premature to override planning during the rest of the week and create further confusion.

It is of note that the owner has been quick attempt to extend the licencing hours yet has made no effort to apply for planning permission for the licensable activities.

# Objection to a Variation of the License for Wymondham Sports Bar and Club, 1 Town Green Wymondham NR18 OPL

I write again in the strongest terms possible to object to the Application to Vary the License that was granted on 5<sup>th</sup> of October 2018.

It is most unreasonable, for all those concerned, that this subject should be raised again less than 2 weeks after the license was granted and calls into question why arguments presented now were previously withheld.

My objections remain, as they were for the original application, and which are set out clearly my letter 27<sup>th</sup> August 2018 which I attach. These are as valid now as they were then and are based on unreasonable noise nuisance and public disorder.

I would ask that this letter and every other letter of objection to the first application should be taken into account when considering this Application for Variation.

The undisputable fact remains that the business that the Applicant wishes to run is totally unsuitable in this residential area. It has to be recognised that there are bedrooms and private gardens just a few metres from the smoking area where uncontrolled noise and foul language abounds.

I would like to bring to the attention of the committee that this business is now being run in breach of the Planning Permission for this premises, which has been in force for the last 36 years. At the end of this letter I set these out and you will see that preserving residential amenity was paramount when the original planning permission was granted.

A condition of the existing Planning Permission clearly states that the premises should not be used after 11.30 p.m. which means that it should be vacated by this time. I would ask that the Licensing Application respects this condition.

Nothing that the Applicant can claim can avoid the fact that his original Application and this Variation will destroy the residential amenity of the area.

It cannot be right that the benefit of one is at the expense of several families, their children and grandchildren. For this reason, I sincerely ask you to reject this Variation.

# Objection to New Premises License for Wymondham Snooker Club, 1 Town Green Wymondham NR18 OPL

I write to object in the strongest terms possible to the granting of a New Premise License for this Club.

We are one of the closest residents to the back of the Club where most of the noises occurs.

You will know that for many years this was a Snooker Club which was relatively quiet and acceptable to local residents. Under new ownership or management it now appears to be transforming itself into a late night drinking and dancing venue – effectively a Night Club which already has had a major impact on local residents.

This area is mainly residential and has been for hundreds of years, it is also a conservation zone. It seems self evident that this is entirely the wrong location for a Night Club with all the associated noise and social disruption.

If this license is granted and the Club encouraged to thrive it will be the cause of endless justifiable complaints from residents needlessly wasting the resources of the Police and the Council Officers — something that would be avoided by its refusal.

# The Prevention of Public Noise

My main objection is unreasonable noise which is already occurring on a daily basis.

The management of the club are either unable or unwilling to do anything about this while telling the Council Officers that they are.

The South Norfolk Council document on Noise (revision 23.05.16) gives a very clear example of Statutory Nuisance and this is being infringed on a daily basis.

I have been raising this with the Council since May and will continue to do so ref 8/14254/EPNN42. Your Rick Bower has spoken to the Owner, but it has made no difference.

Were this application to be granted then a practical solution would have to be found and enforced to address the current Statutory Nuisance infringement that is on going. Such a solution would require sound proofing, only allowing music inside with all doors and windows shut, a noise limiter and controlling and policing the shouting in the garden. The reality is that this will not happen and Statutory Nuisance will occur on a daily basis and will require the permanent deployment of Police and Council Officers.

At the moment we cannot get our grandchildren to sleep nor sleep ourselves while the noise is ongoing and this is frequently from mid afternoon until the early hours of the morning.

I would emphasis that the issue it is not only the loud playing of music but also the shouting which becomes more unpleasant and aggressive as the evening wears on - presumably fueled by alcohol.

# The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The present circumstances in this regard are appalling. Through weak management there appears to be no control of alcohol consumption. As a result the noise from the club, particularly in the garden, gets louder, more unpleasant and aggressive as the evening goes on.

When the customers finally leave the club there is unreasonable noise, vomit, urination, foul language and arguing.

Many of the club's customers come by car and have little regard for parking regulations and use the paved area around the war memorial - this should not be allowed.

# The Protection of Children From Harm


We regularly have our grandchildren to stay over the weekends. This inevitably coincides with substantial noise from the club. The foul language is horrible for young children to hear which means that they cannot play in the garden during the day nor get to sleep at night.

#### Conclusion

This area has two well managed and residentially aware Public Houses, The Feathers and The Green Dragon. The music weekends they have are very few in the year and end promptly. It is entirely the wrong area to now allow and encourage a Night Club particularly one that is not responsibly managed - this should be on an industrial park where their noise and activities do not ruin the lives of normal people.

I would ask you to carefully consider these objections and refuse this application any other associated applications.

# Amendment to premises license Wymondham Sports Bar 1 Town Green Wymondham NR18 OPN

On the 25th August 2018 I wrote to you to object to the granting of a new premises licence for the above. After a Licensing Hearing on the 5th October 2018 your Committee came to a decision which appeared to be a compromise between the applicant and the objectors.

Two weeks later the Applicant wishes to extend the hours of operation. Extending the opening hours would again mean being in our garden unpleasant during the day and impossible to sit and relax during the evenings. It makes sleeping impossible until the noise stops and residents have to put up with foul language and bad hehaviour. It is a statutory nuiscance.

Since the granting of the licence in October there has continued to be raucous laughter and shouting coming from the back area which goes on well after the appointed hours particularly on 27th October (until after 11.45pm) and 16th November (until after 12.35am). Glasses and cigarette butts still litter the street and shouting continues when people leave the Bar. Nothing has changed. Granting an amendment would mean noise and bad behaviour continuing until later in the night, in fact everything that was complained about in August. A copy of my letter of the 26th August is attached.

I would reiterate that this Sports Bar is in a residential area and is detrimental to this area.

# New Premises License for Wymondham Snooker Club, 1 Town Green, Wymondham NR18 OPN

I am writing to oppose the granting of a license to the Wymondham Snooker Club. We moved to Vicar Street, Wymondham five years ago when the Snooker Club was just that. There was talking and laughing outside but this was mainly during the afternoon and early evening.

Since the Snooker Club has been changed to a Sports Bar the noise on Thursdays through to Sundays has been excessive and continuous often until midnight and beyond. This makes being in the garden unpleasant and the evenings very difficult. Sleeping while this noise goes on is impossible.

I understand that most licenses include a responsibility to ensure quiet and orderly exit from the building within a given time. The raucous laughter, shouting and bad language continues for an hour or more after the music stops and then continues in the street. Glasses are left in the street and on windowsills, people urinate down our alleyway and with cars revving, banging car doors and more shouting the noise continues.

We have two pubs in the near vicinity both of which have a premises license but both of which only have live music three or four times a year. This is perfectly acceptable, they obey the rules, stop on time and make sure the customers leave in a quiet and orderly fashion. This is not the case with the Sports Bar. There is no justification for such an establishment in this area. It would effectively be a night club and should be on an Industrial Estate where it would not cause problems for local residents.

To sum up this Sports Bar is detrimental to other local amenities, it is surrounded by residential properties, it causes sleep deprivation and is a statutory nulsance and I would ask that the license is not granted.

#### PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE AND CRIME AND DISORDER

When the Licensing Committee granted the new license they restricted the opening hours Monday to Thursday to 23 00hrs.as a condition of the new premises license

The original Snooker Club operated within these hours and had done so since the original License was granted in 1982. At that time all activities were indoors and there was no outside smoking area. To extend these hours from those long established would inevitably cause more public nuisance. As stated in our letter of objection dated Sept.6<sup>th</sup> 2018 when inebriated patrons leave the club there can be, and often is, shouting, foul language, fights, broken glass, banging of car doors and general disturbance around the War Memorial outside our house. There is no regular police presence in the area, the cameras installed at great expense a few years ago, are not working. The area is mainly residential and also a conservation area. If this variation is allowed it goes against the judgment of the committee who recognized the public nuisance and potential for crime and disorder, restricted the hours and imposed further conditions.

We hope and trust that this variation will be rejected. The premises are open to midnight on Friday and Saturday when unsocial behavior does occur and we hope this is all we have to tolerate.



drinking at their premises. This may be incorporated within the applicant's age verification policy.

The Act provides a legal responsibility to make sure that children, young people and vulnerable adults are protected from harm at licensed premises. The guidance requires that children must be protected from "physical, psychological and moral harm", premises allowing persons under the age of 18 are expected to have systems in place to safeguard children and young people. #### **Access to Cinemas**

In the case of premises which are used for film exhibitions, mandatory conditions will apply restricting access to those who meet the required age limit in line with any certificate granted by the British Board of Film Classification or, in specific cases, a certificate given to the film by the licensing authority itself or any specified film classification body.

It may also be necessary to impose a condition to restrict the admission of children to theatres which are incorporating adult entertainment in their productions.

#### **Adult Entertainment**

Where regulated entertainment provided on premises is of an adult or sexual nature the licensing authority may, where relevant representations are received, give appropriate and additional consideration as to whether to grant a premises licence when the premises are in the vicinity of:

- residential housing
- schools
- play areas
- children's nurseries or preschool facilities
- places of religious worship or education
- historic buildings
- tourist attractions
- · predominantly family shopping areas
- community facilities or public buildings e.g. youth clubs, libraries & sports centres.

In so far as it relates to the licensing objectives, and taking into account location, the licensing authority may determine the nature of any external signage for premises providing adult entertainment. The licensing authority will also expect that the entertainment occurring on the premises should only be visible to those who have chosen to enter, regardless of the location.

The licensing authority is especially concerned that premises providing adult entertainment promote the protection of children from harm objective and will expect operating schedules to address this by adopting strict entrance policies, security measures and staff training and management policies to ensure that this and the other licensing objectives are promoted.

#### 13. Planning

Planning and licensing regimes are separated to avoid duplication and inefficiency.

Licensing applications will not enable a "rerun" of the planning application and licensing decisions will not override decisions taken by the Planning Committee or permissions granted on appeal. There is no legal basis for the licensing authority to refuse a licence application on the basis of a planning permission or the lack of the same.

There are circumstances when as a condition of planning permission a terminal hour has been set for the use of premises for commercial purposes. Where these hours are different to the licensing hours, the applicant must observe the earlier closing time. Premises operating in breach of their planning permission would be liable to prosecution under planning law.

#### 14. Temporary Event Notices

Certain temporary events are not required to be licensed but must be notified to the licensing authority as a temporary event notice. However, depending on the nature and location of such events, these can have serious crime and disorder and public nuisance implications. Organisers of these events are encouraged to submit their notification as soon as reasonably practicable to enable Norfolk Constabulary, community protection and the licensing authority to work with them to identify any risks.

A standard temporary event notice must be received a minimum of ten clear working days
