DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AT MEETINGS

When declaring an interest at a meeting Members are asked to indicate whether their interest in the matter is pecuniary, or if the matter relates to, or affects a pecuniary interest they have, or if it is another type of interest. Members are required to identify the nature of the interest and the agenda item to which it relates. In the case of other interests, the member may speak and vote. If it is a pecuniary interest, the member must withdraw from the meeting when it is discussed. If it affects or relates to a pecuniary interest the member has, they have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public but must then withdraw from the meeting. Members are also requested when appropriate to make any declarations under the Code of Practice on Planning and Judicial matters.


If yes, you need to inform the meeting. When it is discussed, you will have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public, but must then withdraw from the meeting.

1. Introduction

- The purpose of this report is to determine an application that has been made by Mr Michael Francis for a new premises licence for Wymondham Sports Bar & Club, Town Green, Wymondham, Norfolk. Relevant representations have been made regarding this application. 7
- Given the above, the application must be determined by a hearing of the Licensing and Gambling Acts Sub Committee. 1.2
- In determining the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community, the Sub-Committee must give appropriate weight to: 1.3
- the steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives
- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance;
- the protection of children from harm
- the representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties
 - the Revised Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003
- South Norfolk Council's Statement of Licensing Policy published in January 2016

2. Background

- South Norfolk Council is the authority responsible for issuing licences within the district under the Licensing Act 2003, which came nto effect on the 24 November 2005. 2.1
- Since the Licensing Act 2003 came into effect, further legislative amendments have been made through the Live Music Act 2012 and the Deregulation Act 2015. 2.2

3. Proposals

Wymondham. The application form is attached as Appendix 1 and the proposed plan of the premises is attached as Appendix 2. An application was made on Monday 13th August 2018 by Mr Michael Francis for Wymondham Sports Bar & Club, Town Green, 3.1

The application seeks to supersede the existing club premises certificate (CPA0044). A copy of the club premises certificate is attached as Appendix 3 for information purposes.

The application requests the following licensable activities:

- A representation has been received from Wymondham Town Council in regard to the timings for recorded music on Friday and Saturday evenings. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 4. 3.2
- A representation has been received from The Licensing Team at Norfolk Constabulary in regard to a record of reports received and engagement involving Police Licensing Team. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix 5. 3.3
- A representation has been received from the Planning Department in regard to a planning restriction on operating hours. A copy of this representation is attached as Appendix 6. The applicant has advised of his intention to submit an application to the Planning Department to amend the hours accordingly. 3.4

Copies of the representations are attached as Appendix 7 and a Nine letters of objection have been received from local residents with regard to the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime map highlighting the location of properties for those residents raising an objection as Appendix 8. 3.5
- Appendix 9 details the hours presently licensed for other premises within the town of Wymondham for your information. 3.6
- determination may not be delegated to officer level. This determination should only be made in relation to received representations The application for a new premises licence must be determined by a hearing of the Licensing Sub-Committee, as under the Act, relevant to the content of this application, the four licensing objectives, the Revised Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and South Norfolk Council's Statement of Licensing Policy published in January 2016. 3.7

4. Current Position/Findings

- The Revised Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 Section 9.45 states: -4.1
- Where businesses have indicated, when applying for a licence under the 2003 Act, that they have also applied for planning permission or that the intend to do so, licensing committees and officers should consider discussion with their planning counterparts prior to determination with the aim of agreeing mutually acceptable operating hours and scheme designs"
- A copy of the relevant section of the Statement of Licensing Policy is attached as Appendix 10. 4.2

The Licensing Act 2003 has been amended by the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015 so that a licence is not required to stage a performance of live music, or the playing of recorded music if: 4.3

Live music: no licence is required for:

- A performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
- A performance of amplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- A performance of amplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

Recorded music: no licence is required for:

Any playing of recorded music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

5. Other options (if necessary)

The authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such of the steps mentioned below (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. 5.1

The steps are -

(a) To grant the licence subject –

- to the conditions mentioned in subsection (2)(a) modified to such extent as the authority considers [appropriate] for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and \equiv
 - any conditions which must under section 19, 20 or 21 be include in the licence; \equiv



- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
 - (d) to reject the licence
- **5.2** There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days.

6. Recommendation

- benefits for or against making the determination, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and The Sub-Committee is expected to come to its determination based on an assessment of the evidence on both the risks and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. 6.1
- The Sub-Committee must make its determination within the period of five working days beginning with the day or the last day on which the hearing was held 6.2
- Where a licensing authority determines an application, it must notify the determination and its reason of making it to -6.3
 - (a) the holder of the licence
 - (b) the applicant
- (c) any person who has made relevant representations, and
- the chief officer of police for the police area (or each police area) in which the premises are situated



b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV to record the main public areas of the premises including the front of the venue and outside smoking area. CCTV to record for a minimum of 28 days and footage available to Police or Licensing Authority on request.

An incident and refusal book to be kept at the premises to record any incidents of disorderly behaviour and refused sales of alcohol. This book will be available to Police or Licensing Authority on request.

Patrons will be prevented from taking open vessels of alcohol off the premises.





Police have received a copy of the application for a new premises licence for 1 Town Green, Wymondham now called Wymondham Sports Bar but previously known as Wymondham Snooker Club.

This application was applied for following advice from Norfolk Police as it was established that the venue wasn't operating correctly in accordance with the legislation to operate under a Club Certificate.

The venue has benefited with holding a club certificate for many years and has had changes in ownership during this time. However following reports of the venue operating outside the permitted hours on their licence and noise complaints received, Officers carried out further investigations and established that the management were not complying with the Club certificate eligibility.

Below is a record of reports received and engagement involving the Police Licensing Team (starting with the oldest first):

06/08/17 - 00.00 hrs

Call received from a local resident who believes noise is coming from the snooker club and advised that this happens every Friday and Saturday night and that the venue breaches their licence as they only have a licence until 2300 hrs.

08/08/17 –Letter sent to the venue from Police Licensing advising of the complaint and reminding them to comply with the hours permitted.

12/08/17 - 2356 hrs

Call received from a local resident who believes that there are still customers inside the premises however licence is until 2300 hrs. Report includes people being outside the front and shouting and swearing and can hear drinks being ordered. Officers attended at 00.05 hrs to find 5 people inside but premises is all locked up and no persons seen outside.

23/09/17 -19.06 hrs

Call received of a report of Male and female fighting however nothing further established on attendance

03/06/18 – Police Licensing attended the venue following information of unlicensed activity taking place at weekends. On attendance a band was playing, there was loud music outside the venue. Spoke to owner Michael Francis who states he has recently changed his licence to later however he was unable to provide an amended licence to confirm this. Officer advised he would check this with SNDC on Monday and verify this claim.

05/06/18 - Following confirmation by SNDC that no changes to the licence had been made, a letter was sent to the venue warning of enforcement action if any further reports of unlicensable activity take place.

29/06/18 – Follow up visit made to the venue by Police Licensing Officers. This was to reinforce to management that they need to comply with hours permitted and that the venue needs to apply for a premises licence. Met with manager Ryan Parfitt who advised that he has now taken management of the property of the prope

Following Police intervention, the venue management applied for a number of TENS to permit the extension the licensable activity at the venue, which include:

24/08/18 - Disco for 90th Birthday until 00.30 hrs

07/09/18 -Live band for a 50th Birthday until 00.30 hrs

17/08/18- Live Music until 00.30 hrs

03/08/18- Live band and Juke Box until 00.30 and on 04/08/18

21/07/18 - 30th Birthday celebration until 00.30 hrs

16/06/18 - TEN applied for but rejected due to out of time

14/06/18 - Live Music until 00.30 hrs

19/08/17 - Charity Music Event until midnight

26/08/17 – 18th Birthday Party until midnight

The Police received no reports of incidents or noise nuisance during these TENs.

The Operating schedule within the Premises licence application includes staff training with written records, CCTV to record for 28 days, incident and refusal book to be in operation and Challenge 25 Policy. Therefore Police have no further conditions to request to impose onto the licence.

Apart from the report of a fight in Sept 2017, there are no specific incidents linking crime and disorder to this venue in the last year. My understanding is that the venue will continue to operate as a club with a membership scheme in place however it will be licensed in the form of a premises licence.

I acknowledge that the venue has caused an impact to local residents with noise from music and patrons outside. Officers evidenced this when they attended on the 3rd June 2018. It may be appropriate for further restrictions to be added to the licence to promote the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.

I hope this letter assists the Licensing Committee with their decision.



Condition 4 of this application does not allow operation between 11:30pm and 9am. I note that the licence application asks for operational times up to 12:30am on certain days.

I cannot see an application that varies the condition since 1982 so unless the applicant is aware of one, or the operation can be proved to have been ongoing at these later times for more than 10 years, a variation of condition application on the planning permission would be required to operate the full times listed on the licence. PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

BACKGROUND The original license was granted for a Snooker Club some time ago, even before the smoking laws came into force.

The granting of the license had minimum impact, as most smoking was indoors. When the rear smoking area was established there was noise and smoke from there. Although there was noise, smoke and some rowdy behavior, we tolerated it. Earlier this year the snooker tables were removed and the club had a new sign, Wymondham Sports Bar and Club. There was no notification of Change of Use.

Late night extensions have been granted, again with no notification. Very loud music events have been held and two nearby residents, ourselves and no. 8 have already sent complaints to the

Environmental Protection Team. Associated with loud music there has been unbearable noise from the smoking area which is only 20 yards from our house and 10 yards from our outside sitting area. It has been impossible to sleep in our rear bedroom and all doors and windows have to be shut but sometimes the noise reverberates through the house. There appears to be no form of sound insulation and in spite of notices having been posted requesting consideration for neighbours, there has been no reduction in the level of noise.

This is the current situation. As explained above, the premises are already causing PUBLIC NUISANCE, as defined in South Norfolk Council's document on noise. The granting of a new License

permitting live music until 23 30 on a daily basis and recorded music until midnight Mon. to Thurs. and 00 30. Fri. and Sat. with the associated supply of alcohol would cause even more public nuisance

than that already notified to your Environmental Team and should not be granted.

PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER.

When inebriated patrons leave the club at approximately midnight we can have shouting, foul language, fights, broken glasses, banging of car doors and general disturbance outside the front of our house and round the War Memorial. If the new



license is granted we could have this disturbance until 1 00am or later even at the front of our house, having already vacated the rear bedroom! This would be be quite intolerable and would lead to constant disruption as we have had to call the police on more than one occasion. Once at the request of a passer bye who was frightened




CONCLUSION

New Premises License for Wymondham Snooker Club, 1 Town Green, Wymondham NR18 OPN

I am writing to oppose the granting of a license to the Wymondham Snooker Club. We moved to Vicar Street, Wymondham five years ago when the Snooker Club was just that. There was talking and laughing outside but this was mainly during the afternoon and early evening.

Since the Snooker Club has been changed to a Sports Bar the noise on Thursdays through to Sundays has been excessive and continuous often until midnight and beyond. This makes being in the garden unpleasant and the evenings very difficult. Sleeping while this noise goes on is impossible.

I understand that most licenses include a responsibility to ensure quiet and orderly exit from the building within a given time. The raucous laughter, shouting and bad language continues for an hour or more after the music stops and then continues in the street. Glasses are left in the street and on windowsills, people urinate down our alleyway and with cars revving, banging car doors and more shouting the noise continues.

We have two pubs in the near vicinity both of which have a premises license but both of which only have live music three or four times a year. This is perfectly acceptable, they obey the rules, stop on time and make sure the customers leave in a quiet and orderly fashion. This is not the case with the Sports Bar. There is no justification for such an establishment in this area. It would effectively be a night club and should be on an Industrial Estate where it would not cause problems for local residents.

To sum up this Sports Bar is detrimental to other local amenities, it is surrounded by residential properties, it causes sleep deprivation and is a statutory nuisance and I would ask that the license is not granted.

Objection to New Premises License for Wymondham Snooker Club, 1 Town Green Wymondham NR18 OPL

I write to object in the strongest terms possible to the granting of a New Premise License for this Club.

We are one of the closest residents to the back of the Club where most of the noises occurs.

You will know that for many years this was a Snooker Club which was relatively quiet and acceptable to local residents. Under new ownership or management it now appears to be transforming itself into a late night drinking and dancing venue – effectively a Night Club which already has had a major impact on local residents.

This area is mainly residential and has been for hundreds of years, it is also a conservation zone. It seems self evident that this is entirely the wrong location for a Night Club with all the associated noise and social disruption.

If this license is granted and the Club encouraged to thrive it will be the cause of endless justifiable complaints from residents needlessly wasting the resources of the Police and the Council Officers – something that would be avoided by its refusal.

The Prevention of Public Noise

My main objection is unreasonable noise which is already occurring on a daily basis.

The management of the club are either unable or unwilling to do anything about this while telling the Council Officers that they are.

The South Norfolk Council document on Noise (revision 23.05.16) gives a very clear example of Statutory Nuisance and this is being infringed on a daily basis.

I have been raising this with the Council since May and will continue to do so ref 8/14254/EPNN42. Your Rick Bower has spoken to the Owner, but it has made no difference.

Were this application to be granted then a practical solution would have to be found and enforced to address the current Statutory Nuisance infringement that is on going. Such a solution would require sound proofing, only allowing music inside with all doors and windows shut, a noise limiter and controlling and policing the shouting in the garden. The reality is that this will not happen and Statutory Nuisance will occur on a daily basis and will require the permanent deployment of Police and Council Officers.

At the moment we cannot get our grandchildren to sleep nor sleep ourselves while the noise is ongoing and this is frequently from mid afternoon until the early hours of the morning.

I would emphasis that the issue it is not only the loud playing of music but also the shouting which becomes more unpleasant and aggressive as the evening wears on - presumably fueled by alcohol.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The present circumstances in this regard are appalling. Through weak management there appears to be no control of alcohol consumption. As a result the noise from the club, particularly in the garden, gets louder, more unpleasant and aggressive as the evening goes on.

When the customers finally leave the club there is unreasonable noise, vomit, urination, foul language and arguing.

Many of the club's customers come by car and have little regard for parking regulations and use the paved area around the war memorial - this should not be allowed.

The Protection of Children From Harm

We regularly have our grandchildren to stay over the weekends. This inevitably coincides with substantial noise from the club. The foul language is horrible for young children to hear which means that they cannot play in the garden during the day nor get to sleep at night.

Conclusion


This area has two well managed and residentially aware Public Houses, The Feathers and The Green Dragon. The music weekends they have are very few in the year and end promptly. It is entirely the wrong area to now allow and encourage a Night Club particularly one that is not responsibly managed - this should be on an industrial park where their noise and activities do not ruin the lives of normal people.

I would ask you to carefully consider these objections and refuse this application any other associated applications.

I would like to object to parts of this Application on the grounds of public nuisance.

I note that the premises are now to be known as "Wymondham Sports Bar & Club".

The "old" Snooker Club (members only) has been in Town Green for many years. Over recent years they have created a small outside area behind the Club, alongside the rear of properties in Vicar Street. This has created some extraneous noise from excited revellers, which has on occasion been intrusive to the extent that we have been unable to sit out in, and enjoy, our garden in the evening, and have had to close our windows until midnight and beyond!

The new Application is for a Sports Bar, which changes the concept of the "members only" Snooker Club, and is, I am led to believe from staff, to enable drinks "to be served longer" as the applicant proposes that the premises be open to the public, literally, half the total hours in the week! Far longer than the Feathers Public House.

The Town Green end of Wymondham is essentially Residential. There have been more houses built opposite The Feathers Public House, within and behind the old Reeves premises, and all will be affected by additional noise, and the antics of late night drinkers, if the Application is approved in it's present format.

I think the application for live music should be limited, as is the Feathers Public House, to just a couple(?) of events a year, as all live music these days causes noise problems for neighbouring properties, and there never seeems to be any sound monitoring by Authorities, as it generally occurrs "out of hours".

I think the application for supply of alcohol should be restricted to the same hours as the Feathers Public House, and I consider it inappropriate to grant the license application in it's present form as it will cause significant increased public nuisance. It is not unusual now to find disgarded bottles and glasses on my morning walk for the newspaper!

I believe the new license should mirror that of the nearby Feathers Public House.

I am Dr. Christine Buckton and I own a property on Vicar Street, Wymondham which constitutes a house with 4 integral apartments which are leased.

It is with alarm that I read the new licence application for the Wymondham Snooker Club. The Club is situated at the edge of the Town centre in what has for the last century been a residential area and although there are a few retail outlets in this area it is very much Not a commercial or entertainment area. The houses are mostly situated immediately on the streets and are therefore very affected by any noise from adjacent properties. The noise from the Snooker Club already constitutes a nuisance and an intrusion into the life choices of the property dwellers nearby; the tenants of my flats cannot comfortably open their windows and my daughter's property, Number2, Vicar Street, is badly affected by the noise/music at the moment. I wish to object to the new premises licence submitted by Wymondham Snooker Club. I live across the road from the club and property is approximately 15 meters from the entrance to the promises.

I would like to firstly point out that while the business may be registered as "Wymondham snooker club", that is not what it is. When my family moved into our home, two years ago, it was indeed a snooker club but the sign above the door now says "Wymondham Sports Bar and Club". It no longer houses snooker tables and it is essentially a drinking club which often hosts parties and live music in the middle of a primarily residential area. I have enclosed a map of the location and highlighted the residential properties to give an indication the type of area it is.

Having suffered enough over the last year while this club has been operating under a temporary licence. I would like to object to the new premises licence for the following reasons:

- The prevention of public nuisance
- The prevention of crime and disorder
- The protection of children from harm
- Public safety

Prevention of Public nuisance

Over the last year, the club has had numerous parties and social events that feature live and recorded music. The music often shakes the windows of my house and prevents my children from sleeping. Also, when the weather is mild the cliental spill out into the street to smoke, talk, argue and sometimes fight. This occurs directly in front of my house and under the window of my daughter's bedroom (now 13 years old). These events often play music after their licence and the club doesn't empty until way past midnight. When the club does empty, we often have more screaming and shouting and endless taxis running their engines outside our home.

I have engaged the owner of the premises to explain my concerns and, on occasion, I have gone across the road at night when the music should have stopped (but hasn't) to ask for it to cease, but this has not had any effect. I have previously reported the noise and disorder to the local police but I am not aware that anything has been done about it. The mere thought that we may be inflicted with this on a regular basis is horrific. I assume that the current application (to have live music every night apart from Sunday until 11:30pm and recorded music until 12:30am on Friday and Saturday, and extending the alcohol licence every night of the week) is the start of some kind of negotiation. I would like to make it clear that I object to any extension of current activity.

The prevention of crime and disorder

The nights when we experience most disturbance and the nights when the police are called out, tend to occur when the club is open beyond normal licencing hours. On these nights, unsurprisingly, drinkers leaving other pubs in Wymondham at closing time and congregate at the club to continue drinking into the night. When the club closes the drunken behaviour often spills onto the street (directly outside our house). If the current application is accepted then this would be going on **every night of the week**. I can only see that this will lead to more regular police call-outs and late-night noise, disruption and disorder.

There is no useful public service provided by this late-night licence; Wymondham has very good public transport links (bus and rail) into Norwich if people wish to access nightclubs and late bars.

Prevention of children from harm

I have two children at home (13 and 16 years old). My 13 year-old daughter's window looks out toward the club and down the alley that runs alongside it. Not only does the noise stop her sleeping but she gets to listen and to watch all of the activity that occurs outside. Including the arguments, fights and the people urinating or engaged in amorous encounters in the alley by the club (yes that happens as well). This is bad enough at weekends but the current application is requesting that this can happen all week. I have no doubt that his would have a genuine detrimental effect on my children's ability to get healthy sleep and to be able to perform at school.

Public Safety

On occasion, after these events I have the task of clearing up the up the broken glass from the pint glasses that have been disposed of against the wall of my house. Fortunately, I am not aware of anyone being hurt by this yet but I imagine it is only a matter of time.

In brief, this application is essentially attempting to formally establish a night-club in the middle of a residential area of the town. The club already has a track record of failing to comply with its current licencing arrangements and a disregard for the feelings and well-being of local residents. Not only is it a concern for me and my family but I have seen first-hand the stress it is causing our neighbours, particularly the elderly residents. If this application is approved I believe it will drive residents away from the historic centre of Wymondham.


I therefore object to the application in particular under the third of your listed licensing objectives, the prevention of public nuisance, but in general terms all the other three may be relevant from time to time.

I trust that the new licence application will be rejected.



drinking at their premises. This may be incorporated within the applicant's age verification policy.

The Act provides a legal responsibility to make sure that children, young people and vulnerable adults are protected from harm at licensed premises. The guidance requires that children must be protected from "physical, psychological and moral harm", premises allowing persons under the age of 18 are expected to have systems in place to safeguard children and young people. Access to Cinemas

In the case of premises which are used for film exhibitions, mandatory conditions will apply restricting access to those who meet the required age limit in line with any certificate granted by the British Board of Film Classification or, in specific cases, a certificate given to the film by the licensing authority itself or any specified film classification body.

It may also be necessary to impose a condition to restrict the admission of children to theatres which are incorporating adult entertainment in their productions.

Adult Entertainment

Where regulated entertainment provided on premises is of an adult or sexual nature the licensing authority may, where relevant representations are received, give appropriate and additional consideration as to whether to grant a premises licence when the premises are in the vicinity of:

- residential housing
- schools
- play areas
- children's nurseries or preschool facilities
- places of religious worship or education
- historic buildings
- tourist attractions
- predominantly family shopping areas
- community facilities or public buildings e.g. youth clubs, libraries & sports centres.

In so far as it relates to the licensing objectives, and taking into account location, the licensing authority may determine the nature of any external signage for premises providing adult entertainment. The licensing authority will also expect that the entertainment occurring on the premises should only be visible to those who have chosen to enter, regardless of the location.

The licensing authority is especially concerned that premises providing adult entertainment promote the protection of children from harm objective and will expect operating schedules to address this by adopting strict entrance policies, security measures and staff training and management policies to ensure that this and the other licensing objectives are promoted.

13. Planning

Planning and licensing regimes are separated to avoid duplication and inefficiency.

Licensing applications will not enable a "rerun" of the planning application and licensing decisions will not override decisions taken by the Planning Committee or permissions granted on appeal. There is no legal basis for the licensing authority to refuse a licence application on the basis of a planning permission or the lack of the same.

There are circumstances when as a condition of planning permission a terminal hour has been set for the use of premises for commercial purposes. Where these hours are different to the licensing hours, the applicant must observe the earlier closing time. Premises operating in breach of their planning permission would be liable to prosecution under planning law.

14. Temporary Event Notices

Certain temporary events are not required to be licensed but must be notified to the licensing authority as a temporary event notice. However, depending on the nature and location of such events, these can have serious crime and disorder and public nuisance implications. Organisers of these events are encouraged to submit their notification as soon as reasonably practicable to enable Norfolk Constabulary, community protection and the licensing authority to work with them to identify any risks.

A standard temporary event notice must be received a minimum of ten clear working days
