We have been shortlisted for two national awards!

The judges have cast their votes and both Broadland District and South Norfolk Councils are delighted to have been shortlisted at this year's Local Government Chronicle Awards.

Both Councils are recognised on a national stage, as the LGC Awards celebrate the absolute best in local government across the country.

The Councils have been shortlisted in the Public/Public Partnership category with the submission based on the amazing work being done by teams in the Help Hub and specifically the District Direct team.

The judges have also shortlisted the Council's submission promoting the work at the Broadland Food Innovation Centre, which was entered in the Economic Support category.





We are now in our new home, the Horizon Building on Broadland Business Park.

The much lower running and maintenance costs of the Horizon Building will provide huge savings to the Council and any future increases in energy prices will be offset, thanks to lower running costs and the hundreds of solar panels that are already installed. Our new home is also much more environmentally friendly, and the move will help us dramatically reduce our carbon footprint by around 84%. This huge reduction will help us reach our target of achieving Net Zero by 2030.

Another benefit of the Horizon Building is it's easy to access by public transport, and for those with cars, there is plenty of parking available with designated disabled parking spaces. There are also cycle racks for visitors to use.

New spirited tenant for Food Innovation Centre

The Norfolk Spirit Company is the latest business to pick up the keys to their bespoke food-grade unit at the Broadland Food Innovation Centre. The company, which produces Norfolk Rum from local ingredients, are a welcome addition to the food and drink community starting to grow at the Food Enterprise Park near Honingham.

Business owner Ben Crisp said: "We started with an idea that came up at the beginning of the pandemic, about creating a beautiful rum, and then suddenly we found we had a business which was taking off. It soon made sense to move into this amazing Centre because it gives us the space and ideal environment to develop new lines, build our network and explore opportunities. We can also stay in Norfolk, which is incredibly important to us."

Norwich-based hand-made frozen meals brand, Farmyard Frozen, will also soon be moving into the Broadland Food Innovation Centre as part of their continued growth. The business which was born out of the Covid lockdowns, has outgrown current production facilities.

Farmyard Frozen is the brainchild of Chef Andrew Jones and his wife Hannah Springham, the culinary figures behind the award-winning Farmyard restaurant in Norwich and The Dial House in Reepham. They create refined, chef-prepared, frozen meals made with top quality, seasonal and locally sourced ingredients and supply local farm shops and delis as well as nationwide retailers.





Hannah said: "When we heard about the food production units at the Broadland Food Innovation Centre it sounded exactly what we were looking for because the facilities are first class. It's also exciting that we will be at the heart of a supportive community of innovative food and drink businesses."

The Broadland Food Innovation Centre, offering 13 food-grade incubation units, two test kitchens, a sensory kitchen, meeting rooms and state of the art conferencing facilities, is part of a ground-breaking project designed to support and fast-track the growth and success of food and drink businesses, not just in Broadland but across both Norfolk and Suffolk.

Tenants benefit from being in an ideal environment alongside other food businesses, all accessing bespoke support, with membership of the food and drink cluster. Tenants also have access to research and development being carried out at the world famous Norwich Research Park.

Helping businesses thrive



From budding entrepreneurs to big corporations, we are helping to boost our economy by supporting our business community through our Business Builder programme. The scheme offers funds, training and advice to help Broadland's businesses succeed and grow.

Owner and creator of Native2Norfolk, Finley Robertson, wanted to showcase Norfolk's exciting food and drink scene, starting with a series of farmers' and producers' markets, food fairs and food festivals. However, to help launch his business he needed extra support and that's where our Business Development Team was able to help with expert advice and mentoring, which included a practical online course covering all aspects of running a business.

Finley said: "I've grown up in the business world and seen and managed many things, but I've never received formal training or teaching around aspects of business. The Business Builder course covered everything you need to know and wasn't too long, strenuous, or boring. Alongside the course, the 'portal' was full of useful resources that I still find myself referring to."

As well as supporting start-ups, Business Builder also helps established firms to develop and grow.

Andy Neale at the Black Swan Inn in Horsham St Faith has been running his business for nearly 20 years. Over that time, he has invested in many improvements. In 2013 he converted an outbuilding to create eight new rooms to let, and in 2018, he built a large extension to house three new rooms and a function room.

Andy said: "The Development Grant I received through the Business Builder scheme has meant I can upgrade the older rooms to keep pace with modern expectations."

He will use the money to install USB plug points, new carpets and furniture. He added: "This investment means I can charge more for the rooms and increase the occupancy rate, which in turn, will mean I can afford to hire another employee."

By investing in local businesses, the Council is helping to create a thriving local economy and more jobs for local people.

Andrew Morton, owner of Bluebell Wood Burial Ground, also successfully applied for a Development Grant through the scheme, which meant he could afford to purchase a GPS satellite reader that can pinpoint a burial site and a new electronic buggy that will help the business up its green credentials and meet its carbon neutral targets.

This project is part-funded by the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

From repairing the roof of Reepham's Bircham Centre, to installing solar panels at Rackheath Pavilion or refurbishing Hellesdon Community Centre's toilets, our new Pride in Place initiative has been making key improvements to your community spaces.

Pride in Place grants are available to local town and parish councils, community groups, and voluntary groups, to make your local environment feel safe and look attractive, help your community venues thrive and fund community-led projects that foster a sense of belonging.

One community space to benefit from the grant is the Bircham Centre in the heart of Reepham. This building was gifted to the town over 100 years ago and is home to the town's library,

Love your Local **Farm Shops**

Here in Broadland, we are lucky enough to be surrounded by farms that grow and rear produce, much of which you can buy from your local farm shop.

There are some amazing farm shops in our district that produce and sell fresh, high-quality produce, from delicious cheeses to free range eggs and locally reared meat. For starters look out for Little Norfolk Farm in Horsford, Beeston Garden Centre Farm shop on the North Walsham Road, Eves Hill Farm near Reepham, White House Farm in Sprowston, the Blofield Farm Shop off the A47 and the small but mighty little Egg Shed near Burlingham. Don't forget online shops too, such as Swannington Farm to Fork where you can go to pick up your order or get it sent to your home.

They also support other local producers by selling their products too. Everything from honey to wine, bread to cakes and much more can be found in Broadland's farm shops.

When you buy from a farm shop, you're not just getting delicious, quality products straight from the farm to your fork, but you're also supporting our local farmers and businesses, which puts money back into the community and creates jobs for local people. It's an easy way to cut down food miles too.

The Team at The Goat Shed said: "We work alongside many incredible local artisan producers and others from further afield to ensure our award-winning farm shop is stocked with an array of

The Changing Places Consortium contributed £50,000, Broadland District Council £30,000 and the venues themselves funded the project with £20,000.



Currently in its 14th year, this well-established run is a firm favourite on the East Anglia race calendar, attracting hundreds of runners of all ages and abilities from all over the county.

Jill Simmons, who took part last year, said: "The race was so well organised and the atmosphere fantastic, everyone was so friendly and spurred each other on. I can't wait for this year's event." Starting in Aylsham, on the Marriott's Way trail, the run winds its way through some of Norfolk's most picturesque countryside, before finishing in the quaint market town of Reepham.

Being mostly off road, the route is the perfect terrain for those who love to hit the trails but also people new to running due to the softer footing.

Friendly marshals and spectators will line the route, so runners are supported all the way round. The top three male and female athletes will receive trophies, as well as the winners of each age group up to 70 years.

Aylsham has officially been declared a 'Mindful Town' as part of our project to support people suffering with mental health issues in Broadland.

The Council has worked with partner organisations to provide free training sessions as part of the Mindful Towns and Villages project (MTVP), enabling people in Aylsham to become certified Wellbeing Champions.

The project ensures that immediate support is available in the community and in the workplace, and raises awareness of mental health issues while challenging the associated stigma.

We are working with Norfolk and Suffolk Foundation Trust's Wellbeing Service and workplace health provider Thriving Workplaces to train and support local community groups, schools and businesses to create hundreds of Wellbeing Champions, with funding from the North Norfolk Health and Wellbeing Board, part of the Norfolk and Waveney Integrated Care System.

All organisations that take part in the Mindful Towns and Villages Project will receive branding that shows they're certified, in recognition of their commitment and training.

Our Help Hub is supporting all of the newly-created Wellbeing Champions and the Help Hub has recruited a Mental Health Support Worker to talk through residents' concerns and provide advice on next steps, and the different services available.





MTVP will be rolling out across the district, so if you are a community group, a business or an organisation in Broadland that would like to have free mental health training, go to southnorfolkandbroadland.gov.uk/mindfultowns to find out more and sign up.

Help with financial hardship



Our Financial Wellbeing Team, part of the Help Hub, support individuals and families to take control of their finances.

The team provides advice on living costs, welfare benefits and debt solutions. They also provide funding to low-income households to help with essential costs such as utility bills.

In the last year, the team have supported over 1,200 households and have issued over £450k in Household Support Fund grants to families on low incomes.

The Household Support Fund is delivered in partnership with Norfolk County Council and the Department for Work and Pensions and provides support to address severe financial hardship generated by rising costs of living.

The scheme has been extended until March 2024 and can help with costs such as energy, heating oil, water bills and other household bills.

Funding is subject to an assessment and is delivered as part of a wider package of support which includes debt and money management advice.

Helping first time buyers

A new scheme has been launched to help first-time buyers get a foot on the property ladder.

The First Homes scheme is a government initiative that offers eligible first-time buyers the chance to buy new, affordable, energy efficient homes in their local area at a discount of at least 30% of the market value.

The scheme is designed to help local residents remain in the areas where they grew up and enable them to stay close to family and friends. Using the First Homes scheme can also help by lowering the amount of deposit needed and by helping to make mortgages more affordable too.

To be eligible for the scheme you must be: 18 or older, a first-time buyer, able to get a mortgage for

at least half the price of the home and have a total household income of no more than £80,000. Priority will also be given to people who already live or work in the Broadland area, essential workers and members of the armed forces.

Every home that is sold is valued by an independent surveyor to make sure the discount is based on actual market value. The cost of the house is also capped at £250,000, after the 30% discount has been taken off.

When the time comes to move on, the house can only be sold to someone who is eligible to buy a First Home. They must be given the same percentage discount, based on the home's market value at the time of sale.

These First Homes were delivered as part of a pilot scheme.

Millions of pounds to help homeowners save energy

Broadland District Council has successfully led on a bid to secure £3.4 million of **Government funding to improve** the energy efficiency of privately owned homes in Norfolk.

Funding from the Government's Home Upgrade Grant will be administered by the County's local authorities, which form the Norfolk Warm Homes Partnership.

Grants of up to £38,000 are available to low income households that are off the mains gas grid for improvements such as loft and wall insulation, air source heat pumps and solar panels.

The energy efficient measures will reduce homeowners' carbon

emissions, helping the UK meet its 2050 net zero target.

All grants are subject to survey, the home's suitability for works and the Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) rating.

Eligible properties must be privately owned and have an EPC rating of D, E, F or G.

To qualify for funding, home owners should have a gross annual household income of £31,000 or less, or £20,000 after paying mortgage or rent, or be an owner-occupier in receipt of means tested benefit. Landlords will need to contribute at least one third of the total costs.

Loans for greener homes

Interest free loans of up to £5,000 are available for homeowners keen to up their green credentials.

Broadland District Council have partnered with the Eastern Savings and Loan Credit Union (ESLCU) to offer a limited number of 0% interest free loans for renewable technologies and energy-efficient improvements.

Solar panels, insulation, air source heat pumps and

double glazing are just some of the improvements available for funding under the Broadland Green Loan scheme.

To qualify, you must be a homeowner within Broadland, become a member of the ESLCU and adhere to the installer and warranty requirements.

£10K for green projects



Working with our waste partner, Veolia, we are offering £10,000 to support environmental schemes that will have a lasting impact on the community.

Applications for Broadland's Sustainability Fund opened on 21 April. The Fund supports projects that make a positive and sustainable difference to the local area and delivers long-term social and environmental benefits.

Last year the fund supported 11 grassroots projects across the district, including funding for new

gardening tools for educational charity The Papillon Project, litterpicking equipment and tools for Brundall Community River Watch and money to support new lighting and signage at Reepham charity Scrapbox.

Petula Chenery, Manager of Scrapbox said: "This award means a great deal to us and will make a big difference to our operation and how we can continue to provide reclaimed art and crafting materials saved from landfill here in Norfolk." The Fund is open to all not-for-profit organisations, community groups or individuals operating in Broadland.

Projects should aim to fulfil at least one of the following criteria: enhancing biodiversity, promoting sustainable behaviours (reduce, reuse and/or recycle), protecting or preserving resources and the environment and using recycled, reused or reclaimed materials.

Duncan McBurney, Contract Manager for Veolia Broadland, said: "By reusing items instead of throwing them away we're not only preserving resources, we're also helping local residents looking to save money and build a more sustainable community."

Seeing stars in Broadland



Stargazers can now enjoy Broadland's dark skies from its newest viewing platform at Salhouse Broad, which was part-funded by Broadland District Council.

Visitors tried out the viewing platform and observatory pier in March, at the launch event. The new facilities mean stargazers can now take in the universe's wonders in one of the darkest parts of the country.

Members of the public enjoyed views of the moon in the early evening, and even though clouds made stargazing tricky, they were lucky enough to spot the international space station.

Astronomers from the Norwich Astronomical Society were on hand to share their knowledge of the sky at night, and it was also a chance to celebrate Earth Hour, a symbolic event to show collective support for the planet.

Salhouse Broad is a Dark Skies Hub, which is part of a new network of Broads Discovery Hubs.

Discovery Hubs is an initiative of the Broads Trust in cooperation with the Broads Authority designed to promote sustainable, low-impact discovery of the National Park throughout the year.

The new platform, which is now open to the public, was co-funded by Broadland District Council and the EXPERIENCE project and will be maintained by Salhouse Broad/the Broads Trust.

EXPERIENCE is funded by INTERREG France Channel England Programme via the European Regional Development Fund. The event was organised by EXPERIENCE.

Creating a sanctuary from domestic abuse



We are part of a new Norfolkwide initiative which helps survivors of domestic abuse to continue living in their own homes when it is safe to do so.

The Sanctuary Scheme aims to help survivors to stay in their homes, close to their support networks of friends, family, school and work.

Our trained officers assess the home and if the perpetrator

no longer lives within the same property and has no legal rights to do so, then they can install extra security measures, such as new locks, security lights and alarms to enable survivors to feel secure.

This service is free to all residents whether tenants in social housing, privately renting, or homeowners. In cases where landlord consent is required, our Sanctuary officers will try to obtain this.
