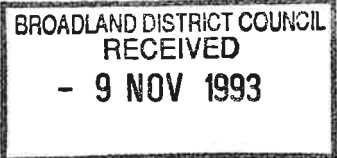

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER, 1963

DIRECTION RESTRICTING PERMITTED DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS the Norfolk County Council, being the local planning authority for the purposes of the Rural Districts of Smallburgh, Blofield and Flegg, St. Faiths and Aylsham and Loddon, are satisfied that it is expedient that development of the description set out in the first schedule hereto should not be carried out on those pieces of land described in the second schedule hereto unless permission therefor is granted on an application made under the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1963.

NOW THEREFORE the said Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1963, HEREBY DIRECT that the permission granted by Article 3 of the said Order shall not apply to development on the said land of the descriptions set out in the first schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

The use on not more than 28 days in total in any calendar year of land covered by water for the mooring of boats, houseboats or other vessels, or caravan bodies mounted on pontoons or similar structures, used for purposes of retail sale.

Being development comprised in paragraph 2 of Class IV of Part I of the First Schedule to the said Order and not being development comprised within any other class.
