

Thorpe St Andrew Neighbourhood Plan Referendum – Information Statement

A Referendum relating to the adoption of the Thorpe St Andrew Neighbourhood Plan will be held on 2 May 2024.

The question which will be asked in the Referendum is:

‘Do you want Broadland District Council & the Broads Authority to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Thorpe St Andrew to help them decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?’

The Referendum area is identified on the attached map.

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on 2 May 2024;

- He or she is entitled to vote in an election of any Ward Councillor of Broadland District Council whose Ward area is in the Referendum area; and
- His or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A persons qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be so registered.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2,362 + £0.059 per elector. The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 11,359 (*figure correct at time of publication*).

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
