Strumpshaw Neighbourhood Development Plan – Final Decision Statement

The decision:

Following a referendum on 22 May 2014, in which more than half of those who voted did so in favour of the Neighbourhood Development Plan, Broadland District Council and The Broads Authority have decided to 'make' the Strumpshaw Neighbourhood Development Plan part of the Local Plan for Broadland District Council and The Broads Authority. This decision was taken at the full Council meeting of 10 July 2014 and full Authority meeting of 11 July 2014 respectively.

Reasons for the decision:

In accordance with the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012, Broadland District Council & the Broads Authority appointed an independent examiner to assess the submitted Strumpshaw Neighbourhood Development Plan, in March 2014.

The examiner conducted her examination based on written evidence and concluded that, subject to certain minor modifications, the Plan meets the basic conditions and that it should proceed to a referendum in Strumpshaw.

Broadland District Council and The Broads Authority considered the recommendations of the examiner on 8 April 2014 and agreed with her proposed modifications of the Neighbourhood Plan.

The Neighbourhood Plan proceeded to a referendum, which took place on 22 May 2014. The results of the referendum were as follows:

If a referendum results in more than half of those voting doing so in favour of the proposal then the Council must make the Neighbourhood Development Plan as soon as reasonably practical, unless it considers that this would breach or be incompatible with any EU obligation or any of the Convention Rights (within the meaning of the Human Rights Act 1998).

At their meeting of 10 July 2014 and 11 July 2014 Broadland District Council and Broads Authority decided that the Neighbourhood Development Plan is not in breach of this legislation and that it should be made part of the Development Plan for the district.
